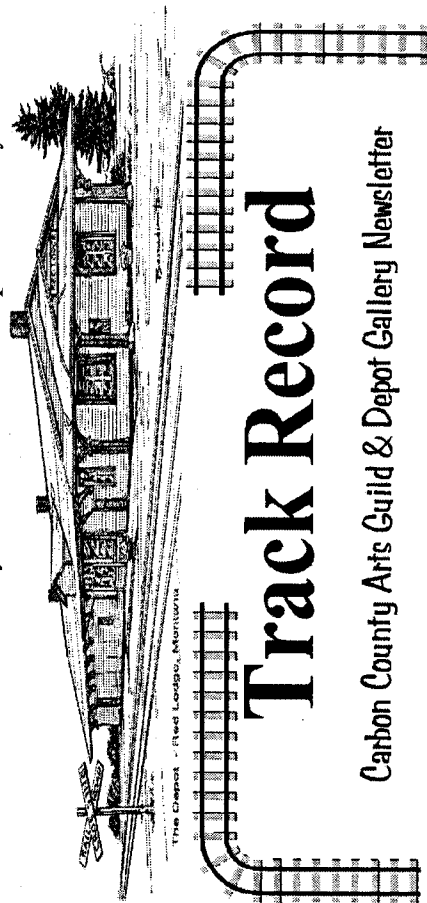

Artist Membership Renewals

Attention Artists: As a reminder, all artists need to have their membership current at the Arts Guild to be able to display and sell their artwork through the gallery. If your membership dues are paid late (within a six month period of showing/selling your work), your new membership renewal date will be one year from your current expiration date. Example: Current membership expiration date is 12/01/06; dues paid/renewed 12/28/06; new membership expiration date will be 12/01/07. This new ruling was put into place in the spring of 2006. Also note that artwork will be taken out of display when dues are late. Always check your mailing label on each newsletter for your current expiration date or call the Guild. Please note this may be the reason for any handwritten date changes of membership expiration date on receipts received after dues are paid. Reminders are sent out periodically to remind you of upcoming or expired membership. If you have any questions about this ruling, please contact the Guild. Thank you.

Juried Show Coming to the Arts Guild in April 2007

The Rocky Mountain Regional Juried Exhibition (RMRJE) will be held in April 2007. We anticipate mailing out the application in January 07. So mark your calendar and watch your mail for the application. If you do not receive an application, please call us or stop on in for one.

The RMRJE will be a bit different this coming year. We have taken to heart the feedback we received after our last juried exhibition and have made a few changes. This year, we will accept entries on slides, CD or professional quality photographs. We will also have an impartial jury and judging process. The juror/judge will decide which pieces will be entered into the competition, then will judge the exhibit first-hand before the exhibit reception to select the award winners. When the pieces are ready for judging, we will cover all signatures and number all pieces clearly enough that the juror/judge will be able to appreciate and judge each piece from a distance. This will also significantly decrease the potential for our juror/judge to be swayed by seeing the signature on each piece.

The juror and judge this year will be Donna Loos, professional artist, art educator, and long term aficionado in the art world. Donna was born in Hyattville, Wyoming in 1931, as one of eight children. She graduated with honors from Eastern Montana College in 1963 and began teaching art in the Billings Public schools that same year. Donna has held offices in the Montana Art Educators Association, the Montana Institute of the Arts and the Montana Institute of the Arts Foundation. Donna is an activist in the arts, judging shows, sponsoring workshops, speaking and traveling around Montana. The high point of her teaching career was organizing the curriculum for many of Billings Junior High schools. Donna retired from teaching in 1991 and keeps a studio in Billings, Montana. "I seem always to be a late bloomer," she says. "At this late date, I am finally maturing into the painter I thought I could be."

So, plan now to be a part of this exhibit. The award winners will receive a cash prize plus the recognition that comes along with winning a juried show. Honorable Mentions will also be awarded.

RUSSELL CHATHAM

LITHOGRAPH EXHIBIT

The Board of Directors is extremely pleased to announce a special show of the work of Russell Chatham, one of Montana's most renowned artists. This show will run during January and February will feature many of Chatham's original lithographs. The exhibit comes to the Guild courtesy of the Montana Art Gallery Directors Association.

Chatham is originally from California, where he earned his living as a sign painter, cabinetmaker and carpenter. In the spring of 1972, he left his California home and moved to Livingston, Montana. As an artist, Chatham is self-taught. He began exhibiting his artwork formally in 1958 and has had over 400 one-man shows since then. His work has been on display in museums, art centers, private galleries, schools, colleges and universities and in cities including Aspen, Santa Fe, Denver, New York, Boston, Philadelphia, Washington D.C., Chicago, Seattle, Dallas, San Francisco, and Los Angeles. His work has also been exhibited in Europe and the Orient. Chatham began printmaking in 1981 and is today regarded as one of the world's foremost lithographers.

Chatham is also a gifted writer. He has written hundreds of articles, short stories, essays and reviews about fly fishing, bird hunting and conservation as well as a number of pieces on food and wine. Since 1967, his work has appeared in *Esquire*, *Sports Illustrated*, *The Atlantic*, *Men's Journal*, *Outside*, *Sports Afield*, *Field & Stream*, *Outdoor Life*, *Gray's Sporting Journal*, *Fly Fisherman*, *Fly Rod and Reel*, as well as in dozens of newspapers and smaller specialty magazines. Chatham is also the founder and publisher of *Clark City Press*, which has published 32 books of fiction, non-fiction, poetry, art, photography, and children's classics since 1989.

In 1996, Chatham opened a restaurant, Chatham's Livingston Bar & Grille. Chatham is now operating his establishment as a bar only and caters special events.

Chatham's lithographs will be on display at the Arts Guild during January and February. The exhibit is free and open to the public during normal Guild hours.

Featured Exhibition for January - The Rock Creek Miniature Invitational Exhibit Continues

During January, the Guild will continue to feature the work of local artists in the Workshop Gallery. This show is our annual Miniature Exhibit, when Deborah asks our artists to create paintings in miniature size, 8 x 10 or smaller. The artists participating in this show live on Rock Creek, along Highway 212, or up the West Fork Canyon or are invited artists from our membership. So, this is truly an exhibit of the artwork of our local artists.

The Miniature Show is always popular. So if you missed out on a small oil by Hal Olson or a landscape from Ben Steele, this is your opportunity. If you've always wanted a Mary Ringer mini-landscape or something from Kevin Red Star, now is your chance. Consider stopping by frequently to see the show. Many of our participating artists will bring in more work as their pieces are sold. The show closes at the end of January, so don't wait too long!

"Chatham, Flowers & Chocolates" A Spring Fundraiser

Our spring fundraiser will take place on February 10th from 6 - 9 pm at the Silver Spur Pub in The Pollard Hotel, Red Lodge. This year, the theme is the dynamic art of Russell Chatham and flowers. Whether our participating artists usually only paint houses or horses, they must incorporate a flower into their piece for this event. And, of course, there will be chocolate, chocolate, and more chocolate!

The fundraising event will happen like this.... Beginning Friday, February 2nd, floral artwork (paintings, boxes, jewelry to fiber) from many of the Guild's artists will go on display at the Arts Guild and silent bidding will begin. Deborah, our Executive Director, anticipates that there will be more than 40 original pieces for the silent auction, so there will be something for everyone's taste and for everyone's pocketbook. The artists are also submitting floral works for a Workshop Gallery exhibit. These pieces will not be part of the silent auction - they will be for direct sale.

The main event is Saturday, February 10th, from 6-9 pm at The Pollard Hotel's Silver Spur Pub. During the evening on February 10th, the silent auction will continue, Russell Chatham will be there to meet and, of course, there will be chocolates to sample, friends to visit with, and some great art to view. Also during the February 10th evening, Mignon Michelic, owner of Mignon's Gifts and Flowers, will be creating a floral bouquet in a live demonstration of her craft. One lucky person will take home the creation at the end of the evening. On the piano will be Denise Finn, who will delight us all with a variety of musical styles - country, classical, and modern.

Tickets for the event cost \$15. For admission, you will receive entry to the evening event at The Pollard, the opportunity to win the fresh floral bouquet created during the evening, do more silent bidding on the floral artwork, and sample chocolate treats.

So, mark your calendar for February 10th at 6 pm. Tickets go on sale mid-January and will be available at the Arts Guild.

Carbon County Arts Guild is growing by leaps and bounds!

And these are examples of how:

- The number of artist members in our Guild has grown from 197 to over 300 in the last year.
- We've just initiated an on-going series of fine arts classes - called **Museum Classes** - to meet the needs of children K-3 who do not have art as a subject in elementary grades.
- We have professional involvement in our Guild: an archaeologist and art historian who directs our bi-weekly Art Appreciation group; an art educator who is responsible for our children's monthly fine art classes; and a lawyer specializing in copyright law who offers his services to our artists.
- The number of participants in our 2006 monthly workshops led by Guild artists was up 40% compared with 2005's numbers.
- Our Summer Art Camp series were very popular last year. In the past, we have offered two weeks of art classes. Due to the need last year, we increased to three weeks and could have offered even more due to community response. Many participants were children from out-of-town.
- One of our main educational plans for 2007 is to develop a "Suitcase Program" to serve other communities in our county offering art classes at their school sites.

And as always, the mission of our Guild is to support, inspire, and encourage all artists. Reaching out to ours and other communities, the Carbon County Arts Guild and Depot Gallery aims to provide art education and exposure to visual, performing and literary arts for the benefit of the broadest possible audience.

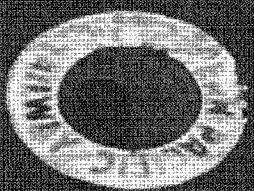
Elliot Eaton painting at Artful Event in the Rockies

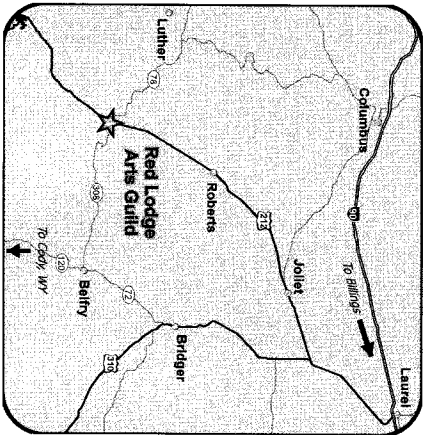

February 24 **Drawing Continued**

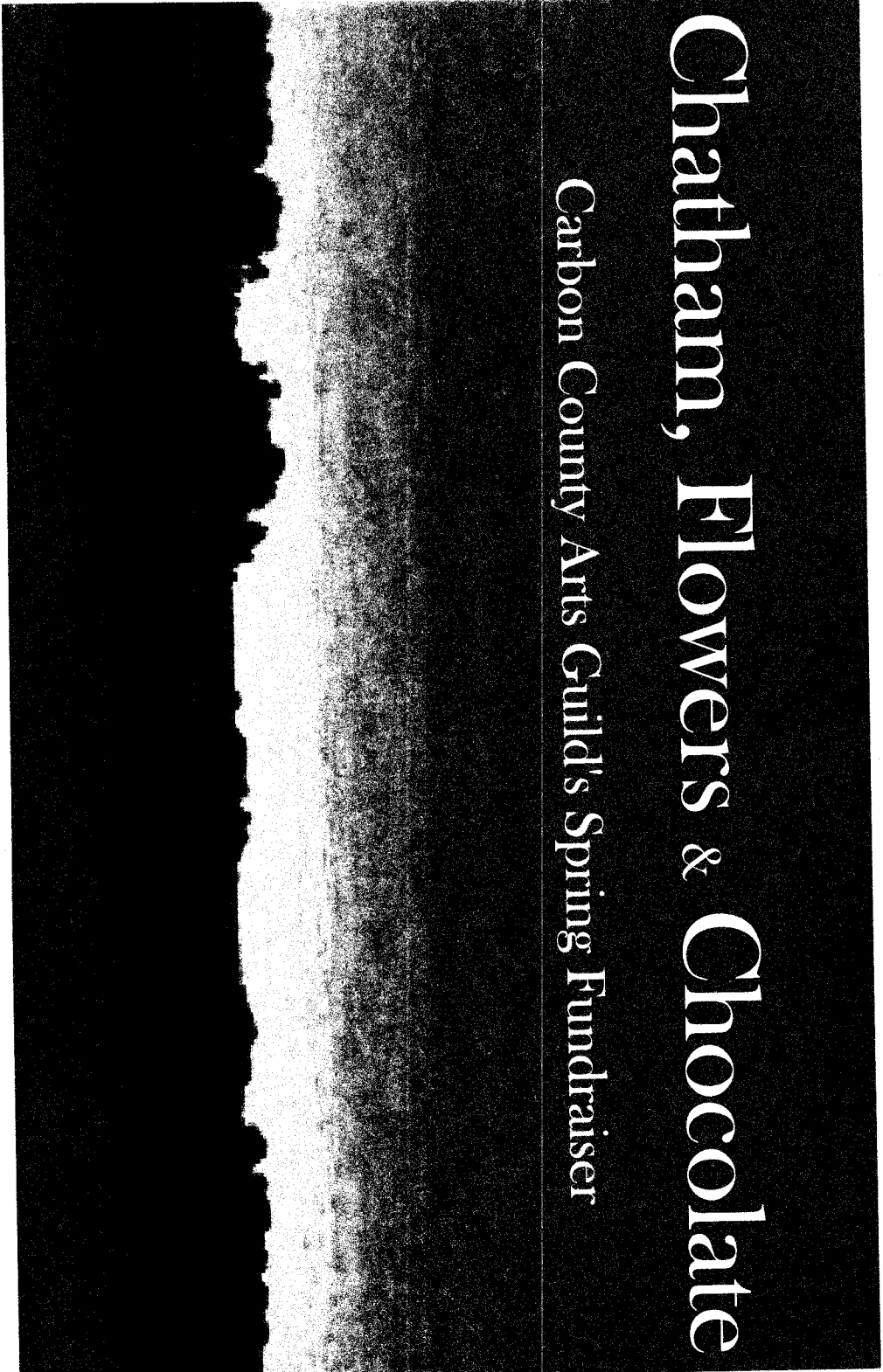
Adding to skills from the first class, students will explore value and texture in their compositions.
