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4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT GENERALLY REVISING ELECTRIC VEHICLE LAWS; ALLOWING

5 FOR STUDY OF THE EFFECTS OF ELECTRIC VEHICLES; REQUIRING THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

6 TO DISCLOSE CERTAIN INFORMATION FOR STUDY; CREATING A STATUTORY APPROPRIATION;

7 DEFINING "ELECTRIC VEHICLE" AND "PLUG-IN HYBRID ELECTRIC VEHICLE"; ALLOWING FOR AN

8 ANNUAL FEE ON ELECTRIC VEHICLES AND PLUG-IN HYBRID ELECTRIC VEHICLES; PROVIDING FOR

9 DISPOSITION OF THE ANNUAL FEE; PROVIDING A STATUTORY APPROPRIATION; AMENDING SECTIONS

10 17-7-502, 61-1-101, 61-3-317, AND 61-3-321, MCA; AND PROVIDING A TERMINATION DATE."

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

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14 NEW SECTION. **Section 1. Required disclosure of electric and plug-in hybrid electric vehicle**

15 **information.** Upon request of the department of transportation or the department of environmental quality for

16 purposes of [sections 1 and 2], the department of justice shall provide electric vehicle and plug-in hybrid electric

17 vehicle registration information that is not considered personal information.

19 NEW SECTION. **Section 2. Electric vehicle fund -- statutory appropriation.** (1) There is an electric

20 vehicle program account in the state special revenue fund to the credit of the department of environmental quality.

21 (2) The electric vehicle program account consists of money deposited into the account from electric

22 vehicle and plug-in hybrid electric vehicle registration fees in accordance with 61-3-321 and money from any other

23 source. Any interest earned by the account must be deposited into the account and used to sustain the program.

24 (3) Twenty-five percent of the funds from the electric vehicle program account must be deposited in the

25 highway restricted account provided for in 15-70-126 for distribution to local governments as provided in

26 15-70-101.

27 (4) Funds from the electric vehicle program account retained by the department of environmental quality

28 must be used for planning, development, implementation, and administration of programs, policies, and projects

29 related to electric vehicle adoption and use in Montana. Eligible activities include but are not limited to:

30 (a) studies and recommendations related to the impacts of electric vehicle adoption on infrastructure and

- 1 the highway fund and appropriate long-term funding mechanisms;
- 2 (b) the planning, installation, maintenance, funding, and financing of electric vehicle infrastructure; and
- 3 (c) marketing, education, and outreach related to electric vehicles and tourism.
- 4 (5) Money in the account is statutorily appropriated, as provided in 17-7-502, to the department of
- 5 environmental quality for the implementation of [sections 1 and 2].

7 **Section 3.** Section 17-7-502, MCA, is amended to read:

8 **"17-7-502. Statutory appropriations -- definition -- requisites for validity.** (1) A statutory

9 appropriation is an appropriation made by permanent law that authorizes spending by a state agency without the

10 need for a biennial legislative appropriation or budget amendment.

11 (2) Except as provided in subsection (4), to be effective, a statutory appropriation must comply with both

12 of the following provisions:

- 13 (a) The law containing the statutory authority must be listed in subsection (3).
- 14 (b) The law or portion of the law making a statutory appropriation must specifically state that a statutory
- 15 appropriation is made as provided in this section.

29 (4) There is a statutory appropriation to pay the principal, interest, premiums, and costs of issuing,

30 paying, and securing all bonds, notes, or other obligations, as due, that have been authorized and issued

1 pursuant to the laws of Montana. Agencies that have entered into agreements authorized by the laws of Montana
 2 to pay the state treasurer, for deposit in accordance with 17-2-101 through 17-2-107, as determined by the state
 3 treasurer, an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest as due on the bonds or notes have statutory

27 **Section 4.** Section 61-1-101, MCA, is amended to read:

28 **"61-1-101. Definitions.** As used in this title, unless the context indicates otherwise, the following
 29 definitions apply:

30 (1) (a) "Authorized agent" means a person who has executed a written agreement with the department

1 and is specifically authorized by the department to electronically access and update the department's motor
2 vehicle titling, registration, or driver records, using an approved automated interface, for specific functions or
3 purposes on behalf of a third party.

4 (b) For purposes of this subsection (1), "person" means an individual, corporation, partnership, limited
5 partnership, limited liability company, association, joint venture, state agency, local government unit, another state
6 government, the United States, a political subdivision of this or another state, or any other legal or commercial
7 entity.

8 (2) "Authorized agent agreement" means the written agreement executed between an authorized agent
9 and the department that sets the technical and operational program standards, compliance criteria, payment
10 options, and service expectations by which the authorized agent is required to operate in performing specific
11 motor vehicle or driver-related record functions.

12 (3) "Bus" means a motor vehicle designed for carrying more than 10 passengers and used for the
13 transportation of persons and any other motor vehicle, other than a taxicab, designed and used for the
14 transportation of persons for compensation.

15 (4) (a) "Business entity" means a corporation, association, partnership, limited liability partnership, limited
16 liability company, or other legal entity recognized under state law.

17 (b) The term does not include an individual.

18 (5) (a) "Camper" means a structure designed to be mounted in the cargo area of a truck or attached to
19 an incomplete vehicle for the purpose of providing shelter for persons. The term includes but is not limited to a
20 cab-over, half cab-over, noncab-over, telescopic, and telescopic cab-over.

21 (b) The term does not include a truck canopy cover or topper.

22 (6) "CDLIS driver record" means the electronic record of a person's commercial driver's license status
23 and history stored as part of the commercial driver's license system established under 49 U.S.C. 31309.

24 (7) "Certificate of title" means the paper record issued by the department or by the appropriate agency
25 of another jurisdiction that establishes a verifiable record of ownership between an identified person or persons
26 and the motor vehicle specifically described in the record and that provides notice of a perfected security interest
27 in the motor vehicle.

28 (8) "Commercial driver's license" means:

29 (a) a driver's license issued under or granted by the laws of this state that authorizes a person to operate
30 a class of commercial motor vehicle; or

1 (b) the privilege of a person to drive a commercial motor vehicle, whether or not the person holds a valid
2 commercial driver's license.

3 (9) (a) "Commercial motor vehicle" means a motor vehicle or combination of motor vehicles used in
4 commerce to transport passengers or property if the vehicle:

5 (i) has a gross combination weight rating or a gross combination weight of 26,001 pounds or more,
6 whichever is greater, inclusive of a towed unit with a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 10,000 pounds;

7 (ii) has a gross vehicle weight rating or a gross vehicle weight of 26,001 pounds or more, whichever is
8 greater;

9 (iii) is designed to transport at least 16 passengers, including the driver;

10 (iv) is a school bus; or

11 (v) is of any size and is used in the transportation of hazardous materials.

12 (b) The following vehicles are not commercial motor vehicles:

13 (i) an authorized emergency vehicle:

14 (A) equipped with audible and visual signals as required under 61-9-401 and 61-9-402; and

15 (B) operated when responding to or returning from an emergency call or operated in another official
16 capacity;

17 (ii) a vehicle:

18 (A) controlled and operated by a farmer, family member of the farmer, or person employed by the farmer;

19 (B) used to transport farm products, farm machinery, or farm supplies to or from the farm within Montana
20 within 150 miles of the farm or, if there is a reciprocity agreement with a state adjoining Montana, within 150 miles
21 of the farm, including any area within that perimeter that is in the adjoining state; and

22 (C) not used to transport goods for compensation or for hire; or

23 (iii) a vehicle operated for military purposes by active duty military personnel, a member of the military
24 reserves, a member of the national guard on active duty, including personnel on full-time national guard duty,
25 personnel in part-time national guard training, and national guard military technicians, or active duty United States
26 coast guard personnel.

27 (c) For purposes of this subsection (9):

28 (i) "farmer" means a person who operates a farm or who is directly involved in the cultivation of land or
29 crops or the raising of livestock owned by or under the direct control of that person;

30 (ii) "gross combination weight rating" means the value specified by the manufacturer as the loaded weight

1 of a combination or articulated vehicle;

2 (iii) "gross vehicle weight rating" means the value specified by the manufacturer as the loaded weight of
3 a single vehicle; and

4 (iv) "school bus" has the meaning provided in 49 CFR 383.5.

5 (10) "Commission" means the state transportation commission.

6 (11) "Custom-built motorcycle" means a motorcycle that is equipped with:

7 (a) an engine that was manufactured 20 years prior to the current calendar year and that has been
8 altered from the manufacturer's original design; or

9 (b) an engine that was manufactured to resemble an engine 20 or more years old and that has been
10 constructed in whole or in part from nonoriginal materials.

11 (12) "Custom vehicle" means a motor vehicle other than a motorcycle that:

12 (a) (i) was manufactured with a model year after 1948 and that is at least 25 years old; or

13 (ii) was built to resemble a vehicle manufactured after 1948 and at least 25 years before the current
14 calendar year, including a kit vehicle intended to resemble a vehicle manufactured after 1948 and that is at least
15 25 years old; and

16 (b) has been altered from the manufacturer's original design or has a body constructed from nonoriginal
17 materials.

18 (13) "Customer identification number" means:

19 (a) a driver's license or identification card number when the customer is an individual who has been
20 issued a driver's license or identification card by a state driver licensing authority;

21 (b) a federal employer or tax identification number when the customer is a business entity that has been
22 issued a federal employer or tax identification number;

23 (c) the identification number assigned by the secretary of state to a business entity authorized to do
24 business in this state under Title 35 if the customer is a business entity that does not have a federal employer
25 or tax identification number other than a social security number; or

26 (d) if the customer has not been issued one of the numbers described in subsections (13)(a) through
27 (13)(c), a number assigned to the customer by the department when a transaction is initiated under this title.

28 (14) (a) "Dealer" means a person that, for commission or profit, engages in whole or in part in the
29 business of buying, selling, exchanging, or accepting on consignment new or used motor vehicles, trailers,
30 semitrailers, pole trailers, travel trailers, motorboats, sailboats, snowmobiles, off-highway vehicles, or special

1 mobile equipment that is not registered in the name of the person.

2 (b) The term does not include the following:

3 (i) receivers, trustees, administrators, executors, guardians, or other persons appointed by or acting
4 under a judgment or order of any court of competent jurisdiction;

5 (ii) employees of the persons included in subsection (14)(b)(i) when engaged in the specific performance
6 of their duties as employees; or

7 (iii) public officers while performing or in the operation of their duties.

8 (15) "Declared weight" means the total unladen weight of a vehicle plus the weight of the maximum load
9 to be carried on the vehicle as stated by the registrant in the application for registration.

10 (16) "Department" means the department of justice acting directly or through its duly authorized officers
11 or agents.

12 (17) "Dolly or converter gear" means a device consisting of one or two axles with a fifth wheel and trailer
13 tongue used to support the forward end of a semitrailer, converting a semitrailer into a trailer.

14 (18) "Domiciled" means a place where:

15 (a) an individual establishes residence;

16 (b) a business entity maintains its principal place of business;

17 (c) the business entity's registered agent maintains an address; or

18 (d) a business entity most frequently uses, dispatches, or controls a motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer,
19 or pole trailer that it owns or leases.

20 (19) "Downgrade" means the removal of a person's privilege to operate a commercial motor vehicle, as
21 maintained by the department on the individual Montana driving record and the CDLIS driver record for that
22 person.

23 (20) "Driver" means a person who drives or is in actual physical control of a vehicle.

24 (21) "Driver's license" means a license or permit to operate a motor vehicle issued under or granted by
25 the laws of this state, including:

26 (a) any temporary license or learner license;

27 (b) the privilege of any person to drive a motor vehicle, whether or not the person holds a valid license;

28 (c) any nonresident's driving privilege;

29 (d) a motorcycle endorsement; or

30 (e) a commercial driver's license.

1 (22) "Electric personal assistive mobility device" means a device that has two nontandem wheels, is
2 self-balancing, and is designed to transport only one person with an electric propulsion system that limits the
3 maximum speed of the device to 12 1/2 miles an hour.

4 ~~(23)~~(24) "Electric vehicle" means a vehicle that is powered solely by an electric motor powered by storage
5 batteries or fuel cells that can be recharged from an external source. The term does not include a low-speed
6 electric vehicle, a medium-speed electric vehicle, or a plug-in hybrid electric vehicle.

7 ~~(23)~~(24) "For hire" means an action performed for remuneration of any kind, whether paid or promised,
8 either directly or indirectly, or received or obtained through leasing, brokering, or buy-and-sell arrangements from
9 which a remuneration is obtained or derived for transportation service.

10 ~~(24)~~(25) (a) "Golf cart" means a motor vehicle that is designed for use on a golf course to carry a person
11 or persons and golf equipment and that has an average speed of less than 15 miles per hour.

12 (b) Except as provided in 61-3-201, a golf cart is exempt from titling, registration, and mandatory liability
13 insurance requirements under this title.

14 ~~(25)~~(26) "Gross vehicle weight" means the weight of a vehicle without load plus the weight of any load
15 on the vehicle.

16 ~~(26)~~(27) "Hazardous material" means:

17 (a) any material that has been designated as hazardous under 49 U.S.C. 5103 and is required to be
18 placarded under 49 CFR, part 172; or

19 (b) any quantity of a material listed as a select agent or toxin in 42 CFR, part 73.

20 ~~(27)~~(28) "Highway" or "public highway" means the entire width between the boundary lines of every
21 publicly maintained way when any part of the publicly maintained way is open to the use of the public for purposes
22 of vehicular travel.

23 ~~(28)~~(29) "Highway patrol officer" means a state officer authorized to direct or regulate traffic or to make
24 arrests for violations of traffic regulations.

25 ~~(29)~~(30) "Implement of husbandry" means a vehicle that is designed for agricultural purposes and
26 exclusively used by the owner of the vehicle in the conduct of the owner's agricultural operations.

27 ~~(30)~~(31) "Kit vehicle" is a motor vehicle assembled from a manufactured kit either as:

28 (a) a complete kit, consisting of a prefabricated body and chassis, to construct a new motor vehicle; or

29 (b) a kit with a prefabricated body to be mounted to an existing motor vehicle chassis and drivetrain,
30 commonly referred to as a donor vehicle.

1 ~~(31)~~(32) "Light vehicle" means a motor vehicle commonly referred to as an automobile, van, sport utility
2 vehicle, or truck having a manufacturer's rated capacity of 1 ton or less.

3 ~~(32)~~(33) "Low-speed electric vehicle" means a motor vehicle, on or by which a person may be
4 transported, that:

5 (a) has four wheels;

6 (b) has a maximum speed of at least 20 miles an hour and no greater than 40 miles an hour as certified
7 by the manufacturer;

8 (c) is propelled by its own power, using an electric motor or other device that transforms stored electrical
9 energy into the motion of the vehicle;

10 (d) stores electricity in batteries, ultracapacitors, or similar devices, which are charged from the power
11 grid or from renewable electrical energy sources;

12 (e) has a wheelbase of 40 inches or greater and a wheel diameter of 10 inches or greater;

13 (f) exhibits a manufacturer's compliance with 49 CFR, part 565, or displays a 17-character vehicle
14 identification number as provided in 49 CFR, part 565; and

15 (g) is equipped as provided in 61-9-432.

16 ~~(33)~~(34) "Low-speed restricted driver's license" means a license limited to the operation of a low-speed
17 electric vehicle or a golf cart issued under or granted by the laws of this state, including:

18 (a) a temporary license or learner license;

19 (b) the privilege of a person to drive a low-speed electric vehicle or golf cart under the authority of
20 61-5-122, whether or not the person holds a valid driver's license; and

21 (c) a nonresident's similarly restricted driving privilege.

22 ~~(34)~~(35) "Manufactured home" has the meaning provided in 15-24-201.

23 ~~(35)~~(36) "Manufacturer" includes any person engaged in the manufacture of motor vehicles, trailers,
24 semitrailers, pole trailers, travel trailers, motorboats, sailboats, snowmobiles, or off-highway vehicles as a regular
25 business.

26 ~~(36)~~(37) "Manufacturer's certificate of origin" means the original paper record produced and issued by
27 the manufacturer of a vehicle or, if in a medium authorized by the department, an electronic record created and
28 transmitted by the manufacturer of a vehicle to the manufacturer's agent or a licensed dealer. The record must
29 establish the origin of the vehicle specifically described in the record and, upon assignment, transfers of
30 ownership of the vehicle to the person or persons named in the certificate.

1 ~~(37)~~(38) (a) "Medium-speed electric vehicle" is a motor vehicle, on or by which a person may be
2 transported, that:

3 (i) has a maximum speed of 45 miles an hour as certified by the manufacturer;

4 (ii) is propelled by its own power, using an electric motor or other device that transforms stored electrical
5 energy into the motion of the vehicle;

6 (iii) stores electricity in batteries, ultracapacitors, or similar devices, which are charged from the power
7 grid or from renewable electrical energy sources;

8 (iv) is fully enclosed and includes at least one door for entry;

9 (v) has a wheelbase of 40 inches or greater and a wheel diameter of 10 inches or greater;

10 (vi) exhibits a manufacturer's compliance with 49 CFR, part 565, or displays a 17-character vehicle
11 identification number as provided in 49 CFR, part 565;

12 (vii) bears a sticker, affixed by the manufacturer or dealer, on the left side of the rear window that
13 indicates the vehicle's maximum speed rating; and

14 (viii) as certified by the manufacturer, is equipped as provided in 61-9-432.

15 (b) A medium-speed electric vehicle must be treated as a light vehicle for purposes of titling and
16 registration under Title 61, chapter 3.

17 (c) A medium-speed electric vehicle may not have a gross vehicle weight in excess of 5,000 pounds.

18 ~~(38)~~(39) "Mobile home" or "house trailer" has the meaning provided in 15-24-201.

19 ~~(39)~~(40) "Montana resident" means:

20 (a) an individual who resides in Montana as determined under 1-1-215; or

21 (b) for the purposes of chapter 3, a business entity that maintains a principal place of business or a
22 registered agent in this state.

23 ~~(40)~~(41) (a) "Motorboat" means a vessel, including a personal watercraft or pontoon, propelled by any
24 machinery, motor, or engine of any description, whether or not the machinery, motor, or engine is the principal
25 source of propulsion. The term includes boats temporarily equipped with detachable motors or engines.

26 (b) The term does not include a vessel that has a valid marine document issued by the U.S. coast guard
27 or any successor federal agency.

28 ~~(41)~~(42) (a) "Motor carrier" means a person or corporation or its lessees, trustees, or receivers appointed
29 by a court that are operating motor vehicles on a public highway in this state for the transportation of property for
30 hire on a commercial basis.

1 (b) The term does not include motor carriers regulated under Title 69, chapter 12.

2 ~~(42)~~(43) (a) "Motorcycle" means a motor vehicle that has a seat or saddle for the use of the operator and
3 that is designated to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground. A motorcycle may carry one
4 or more attachments and a seat for the conveyance of a passenger.

5 (b) A motorcycle designed for use on highways is a motor vehicle unless otherwise prescribed.

6 (c) A motorcycle designed for off-road recreational use is an off-highway vehicle unless it has been
7 modified to meet the equipment standards specified in chapter 9 and has been registered for highway use.

27 (b) An additional fee of \$15 must be collected if a vehicle owner elects to keep the same license plate
28 number from license plates issued before January 1, 2010, when replacement of those plates is required under
29 61-3-332(3).

30 (c) The fees imposed in this subsection (13) must be deposited in the account established under

1 61-6-158, except that \$2 of the fee imposed in subsection (13)(a) must be deposited in the state general fund.

2 (14) The provisions of this part with respect to the payment of registration fees do not apply to and are
3 not binding upon motor vehicles, trailers, semitrailers, snowmobiles, watercraft, or tractors owned or controlled
4 by the United States of America or any state, county, city, or special district, as defined in 18-8-202, or to a vehicle
5 or vessel that meets the description of property exempt from taxation under 15-6-201(1)(a), (1)(d), (1)(e), (1)(g),
6 (1)(h), (1)(i), (1)(k), (1)(l), (1)(n), or (1)(o), 15-6-203, or 15-6-215, except as provided in 61-3-520.

7 (15) Whenever ownership of a trailer, semitrailer, pole trailer, off-highway vehicle, motorcycle,
8 quadricycle, travel trailer, motor home, motorboat, sailboat, personal watercraft, motorized pontoon, snowmobile,
9 motor vehicle owned and operated solely as a collector's item pursuant to 61-3-411, or low-speed electric vehicle
10 is transferred, the new owner shall title and register the vehicle or vessel as required by this chapter and pay the
11 fees imposed under this section.

12 (16) A person eligible for a waiver under 61-3-460 is exempt from the fees required under this section.

13 (17) Except as otherwise provided in this section, revenue collected under this section must be deposited
14 in the state general fund.

15 (18) The fees imposed by subsections (2) through (12) are not required to be paid by a dealer for the
16 enumerated vehicles or vessels that constitute inventory of the dealership.

17 (19) (a) Unless a person exercises the option in either subsection (19)(b) or (19)(c), an additional fee of
18 \$6 must be collected for each light vehicle registered under this part. This fee must be accounted for and
19 transmitted separately from the registration fee. The fee must be deposited in an account in the state special
20 revenue fund to be used for state parks, for fishing access sites, and for the operation of state-owned facilities.
21 Of the \$6 fee, the department of fish, wildlife, and parks shall use \$5.37 for state parks [or as otherwise
22 appropriated by the legislature], 25 cents for fishing access sites, and 38 cents for the operation of state-owned
23 facilities at Virginia City and Nevada City.

24 (b) A person who registers a light vehicle may, at the time of annual registration, certify that the person
25 does not intend to use the vehicle to visit state parks and fishing access sites and may make a written election
26 not to pay the additional \$6 fee provided for in subsection (19)(a). If a written election is made, the fee may not
27 be collected.

28 (c) (i) A person who registers one or more light vehicles may, at the time of annual registration, certify
29 that the person does not intend to use any of the vehicles to visit state parks and fishing access sites and may
30 make a written election not to pay the additional \$6 fee provided for in subsection (19)(a). If a written election is

1 made, the fee may not be collected at any subsequent annual registration unless the person makes the written
2 election to pay the additional fee on one or more of the light vehicles.

3 (ii) The written election not to pay the additional fee on a light vehicle expires if the vehicle is registered
4 to a different person.

5 (20) For each light vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, pole trailer, heavy truck, motor home, motorcycle,
6 quadricycle, and travel trailer subject to a registration fee under this section, an additional fee of \$10 must be
7 collected and forwarded to the state for deposit in the account established in 44-1-504.

8 (21) (a) If a person exercises the option in subsection (21)(b), an additional fee of \$5 must be collected
9 for each light vehicle registered under this part. This fee must be accounted for and transmitted separately from
10 the registration fee. The fee must be deposited in an account in the state special revenue fund. Funds in the
11 account are statutorily appropriated, as provided in 17-7-502, to the department of transportation and must be
12 allocated as provided in 60-3-309.

13 (b) A person who registers one or more light vehicles may, at the time of annual registration, make a
14 written or electronic election to pay the additional \$5 fee provided for in subsection (21)(a).

15 (22) This section does not apply to a motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, or pole trailer that is governed by
16 61-3-721.

17 (23) (a) The \$800 and \$825 amounts collected based on the manufacturer's suggested retail price in
18 subsections (2) and (7) are exempt from the provisions of 15-1-122 and must be deposited in the motor vehicle
19 division administration account established in 61-3-112.

20 (b) By August 15 of each year, beginning in the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, the department of
21 justice shall deposit into the general fund an amount equal to the fiscal yearend balance minus 25% of the current
22 fiscal year appropriation for the motor vehicle division administration account established in 61-3-112. (Bracketed
23 language terminates June 30, 2019--sec. 21, Ch. 351, L. 2017.)"

25 **NEW SECTION. Section 7. Codification instruction.** [Sections 1 and 2] are intended to be codified
26 as an integral part of Title 90, and the provisions of Title 90 apply to [sections 1 and 2].
