5	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REVISING LAWS FOR AIRCRAFT USE IN RELATION TO		
6	WILDLIFE AND NATIONAL FOREST LANDS; DEFINING AN "AIRCRAFT" TO INCLUDE UNMANNED		
7	AERIAL VEHICLES AND OTHER AIRBORNE DEVICES FOR THE PURPOSES OF HUNTING, HAZING,		
8	HARASSING, AND OTHERWISE INTERACTING WITH WILDLIFE; REMOVING THE OBLIGATION FOR THE		
9	DEPARTMENT OF FISH, WILDLIFE, AND PARKS TO PERMIT AIRCRAFT ACTIVITY ON NATIONAL		
10	FOREST LAND; AMENDING SECTIONS 87-6-101, 87-6-107, AND 87-6-208, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN		
11	IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:		
14			
15	Section 1. Section 87-6-101, MCA, is amended to read:		
16	"87-6-101. Definitions. Unless the context requires otherwise, in this chapter, the following definitions		
17	apply:		
18	(1) "Alternative livestock" means a privately owned caribou, white-tailed deer, mule deer, elk,		
19	moose, antelope, mountain sheep, or mountain goat indigenous to the state of Montana, a privately owned		
20	reindeer, or any other cloven-hoofed ungulate as classified by the department. Black bear and mountain lion		
21	must be regulated pursuant to Title 87, chapter 4, part 8.		
22	(2) "Alternative livestock ranch" means the enclosed land area upon which alternative livestock		
23	may be kept for purposes of obtaining, rearing in captivity, keeping, or selling alternative livestock or parts of		
24	alternative livestock, as authorized under Title 87, chapter 4, part 4.		
25	(3) "Aircraft" means any manned or unmanned aerial vehicle or device that is used or intended to		
26	be used for flight in the air.		
27	(3)(4) (a) "Bait" means any animal matter, vegetable matter, or natural or artificial scent placed in an		
28	area inhabited by wildlife for the purpose of attracting game animals or game birds.		



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1	(b)	The term does not include:			
2	(i)	decoys, silhouettes, or other replicas of wildlife body forms;			
3	(ii)	scents used only to mask human odor; or			
4	(iii)	types of scents that are approved by the commission for attracting game an	mals or game

6	(4)<u>(5)</u>	"Closed season" means the time during which game birds, fish, game anima	als, and fur-bearing		
7	animals may n	ot be lawfully taken.			
8	(5) (6)	"Cloven-hoofed ungulate" means an animal of the order Artiodactyla, except	t a member of the		
9	families Suidae	e, Camelidae, or Hippopotamidae. The term does not include domestic pigs, d	omestic cows,		
10	domestic yaks, domestic sheep, domestic goats that are not naturally occurring in the wild in their country of				
11	origin, or bison	1.			
12	(6) (7)	"Conviction" means a judgment or sentence entered following a guilty plea,	a nolo contendere		
13	plea, a verdict	or finding of guilty rendered by a legally constituted jury or by a court of comp	etent jurisdiction		
14	authorized to try the case without a jury, or a forfeiture of bail or collateral deposited to secure the person's				
15	appearance in	court that has not been vacated.			
16	(7)<u>(8)</u>	"Field trial" has the meaning provided in 87-3-601.			
17	(8)<u>(9)</u>	"Fishing" means to take or harvest fish or the act of a person possessing an	y instrument,		
18	article, or substance for the purpose of taking or harvesting fish in any location that a fish might inhabit.				
19	(9)<u>(</u>10)) (a) "Fur dealer" means a person engaging in, carrying on, or conducting whe	olly or in part the		
20	business of buying or selling, trading, or dealing within the state of Montana in the skins or pelts of fur-bearing				
21	animals or predatory animals.				
22	(b)	If a fur dealer resides in Montana or if the fur dealer's principal place of busin	ness is within the		
23	state of Monta	na, the fur dealer is considered a resident fur dealer. All other fur dealers are o	considered		
24	nonresident fu	r dealers.			
25	(10)<u>(1</u>	1) "Fur farm" means enclosed land on which furbearers are kept for purposes	of obtaining,		
26	rearing in capti	ivity, keeping, and selling furbearers or parts of furbearers.			
27	(11)<u>(1</u>2	2) (a) "Fur-bearing animal" or "furbearer" means marten or sable, otter, musk	rat, fisher, mink,		
28	bobcat, lynx, w	volverine, northern swift fox, and beaver.			



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(b) As used in Title 87, chapter 4, part 10, "furbearer" does not include fox or mink.

2 (12)(13) "Game animal" means deer, elk, moose, antelope, caribou, mountain sheep, mountain goat,
3 mountain lion, bear, and wild buffalo.

(13)(14) "Game fish" means all species of the family Salmonidae (chars, trout, salmon, grayling, and
whitefish); all species of the genus Stizostedion (sandpike or sauger and walleyed pike or yellowpike perch); all
species of the genus Esox (northern pike, pickerel, and muskellunge); all species of the genus Micropterus
(bass); all species of the genus Polyodon (paddlefish); all species of the family Acipenseridae (sturgeon); all
species of the genus Lota (burbot or ling); the species Perca flavescens (yellow perch); all species of the genus
Pomoxis (crappie); and the species Ictalurus punctatus (channel catfish).

10 (14)(15) "Hunt" means to pursue, shoot, wound, take, harvest, kill, chase, lure, possess, or capture or 11 the act of a person possessing a weapon, as defined in 45-2-101, or using a dog or a bird of prey for the 12 purpose of shooting, wounding, taking, harvesting, killing, possessing, or capturing wildlife protected by the 13 laws of this state in any location that wildlife may inhabit, whether or not the wildlife is then or subsequently 14 taken. The term includes an attempt to take or harvest by any means, including but not limited to pursuing,

15 shooting, wounding, killing, chasing, luring, possessing, or capturing.

16 (15)(16) "Knowingly" has the meaning provided in 45-2-101.

17 (16)(17) "Livestock" includes ostriches, rheas, and emus.

18 (17)(18) "Migratory game bird" means waterfowl, including wild ducks, wild geese, brant, and swans;

cranes, including little brown and sandhill; rails, including coots; Wilson's snipes or jacksnipes; and mourning
doves.

21 (18)(19) "Negligently" has the meaning provided in 45-2-101.

(19)(20) "Nongame wildlife" means any wild mammal, bird, amphibian, reptile, fish, mollusk,

23 crustacean, or other animal not otherwise legally classified by statute or regulation of this state.

24 (20)(21) "Open season" means the time during which game birds, fish, and game and fur-bearing
 25 animals may be lawfully taken.

(21)(22) "Participating state" means any state that enacts legislation to become a member of the
 Interstate Wildlife Violator Compact.

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(22)(23) "Person" means an individual, association, partnership, and corporation.

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1	(23)(24) "Possession" has the meaning provided in 45-2-101.						
2	(24)(25) "Predatory animal" means coyote, weasel, skunk, and civet cat.						
3	(25)(26) "Purposely" has the meaning provided in 45-2-101.						
4	(26)(27) "Raptor" means all birds of the orders Falconiformes and Strigiformes, commonly called						
5	falcons, hawks, eagles, ospreys, and owls.						
6	(27)(28) "Resident" has the meaning provided in 87-2-102.						
7	(28)(29) "Roadside menagerie" means any place where one or more wild animals are kept in captivity						
8	for the evident purpose of exhibition or attracting trade, on or off the facility premises. It does not include the						
9	exhibition of any animal by an educational institution or by a traveling theatrical exhibition or circus based						
10	outside of Montana.						
11	(29)(30) "Sale" means a contract by which a person:						
12	(a) transfers an interest in either game or fish for a price; or						
13	(b) transfers, barters, or exchanges an interest either in game or fish for an article or thing of value.						
14	(30)(31) "Site of the kill" means the location where a game animal or game bird expires and the person						
15	responsible for the death takes physical possession of the carcass.						
16	(31)(32) "Supplemental feed attractant" means any food, garbage, or other attractant for game						
17	animals. The term does not include growing plants or plants harvested for the feeding of livestock.						
18	(32)(33) "Taxidermist" means a person who conducts a business for the purpose of mounting,						
19	preserving, or preparing all or part of the dead bodies of any wildlife.						
20	(33)(34) "Trap" means to take or harvest or participate in the taking or harvesting of any wildlife						
21	protected by state law by setting or placing any mechanical device, snare, deadfall, pit, or device intended to						
22	take wildlife or to remove wildlife from any of these devices.						
23	(34)(35) "Upland game birds" means sharptailed grouse, blue grouse, spruce (Franklin) grouse, prairie						
24	chicken, sage hen or sage grouse, ruffed grouse, ring-necked pheasant, Hungarian partridge, ptarmigan, wild						
25	turkey, and chukar partridge.						
26	(35)(36) "Wild animal" means an animal that is wild by nature as distinguished from common domestic						
27	animals, whether the animal was bred or reared in captivity, and includes birds and reptiles.						
28	(36)(37) "Wild animal menagerie" means any place where one or more bears or large cats, including						



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1 cougars, lions, tigers, jaguars, leopards, pumas, cheetahs, ocelots, and hybrids of those large cats, are kept in

2 captivity for use other than public exhibition.

3 (37)(38) "Wild buffalo or bison" or "wild buffalo" means a bison that:

- 4 (a) has not been reduced to captivity;
- 5 (b) has never been subject to the per capita fee under 15-24-921;
- 6 (c) has never been owned by a person; and
- 7 (d) is not the offspring of a bison that has been subject to the per capita fee under 15-24-921.

8 (38)(39) "Wildlife sanctuary" means a facility organized as a Montana nonprofit corporation pursuant to

9 Title 35, chapter 2, or in good standing with and accredited by the American sanctuary association or the global

10 federation of animal sanctuaries for the purpose of providing homes for nonreleasable wild animals.

11 Accreditation and good standing must be proven with a copy of an accreditation report completed as required

12 by the accrediting organization.

(39)(40) "Zoo" means any zoological garden chartered as a nonprofit corporation by the state or in
 good standing with and accredited by the association of zoos and aquariums or the zoological association of
 America for the purpose of exhibiting wild animals for public viewing. Accreditation and good standing must be
 proven with a copy of an accreditation report completed as required by the accrediting organization."

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Section 2. Section 87-6-107, MCA, is amended to read:

19 "87-6-107. Unlawful harassment of game animals and game birds with vehicle or device. (1) A 20 person may not concentrate, drive, rally, stir up, run, molest, flush, herd, chase, harass, or impede the 21 movement of or attempt to concentrate, drive, rally, stir up, run, molest, flush, herd, chase, harass, or impede 22 the movement of a game animal or game bird from or with the use or aid of a self-propelled, motor-driven, or 23 drawn vehicle or device, including aircraft. This section does not apply to landowners and their authorized 24 agents engaged in the immediate protection of that landowner's property.

25

(2) The following penalties apply for a violation of this section:

(a) A person convicted of or who forfeits bond or bail after being charged with a violation of this
section shall be fined not less than \$50 or more than \$1,000 or be imprisoned in the county detention center for
not more than 6 months, or both. In addition, the person may be subject to forfeiture of any current hunting,



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1	fishing, or trapping license issued by this state and the privilege to hunt, fish, and trap in this state or to use						
2	state lands, as defined in 77-1-101, for recreational purposes for a period of time set by the court.						
3	(b)	A person convicted of or who forfeits bond or bail after being charged with a	second or				
4	subsequent violation of this section within 5 years shall be fined not less than \$500 or more than \$1,000 or l						
5	imprisoned for not more than 6 months, or both. In addition, the person shall forfeit any current hunting, fishir						
6	or trapping lic	ense issued by this state and the privilege to hunt, fish, and trap in this state fo	or 24 months from				
7	the date of conviction or forfeiture of bond or bail unless the court imposes a longer period."

10	"87-6	-208. Unlawful use of aircraft. (1) Except as provided in 87-3-126, a person	may not:				
11	(a)	kill, take, or shoot at any game bird, game animal, or fur-bearing animal fror	n an aircraft ,				
12	including a helicopter;						
13	(b)	use an aircraft , including a helicopter :					
14	(i)	to locate any game animal for the purpose of hunting that animal during the	same hunting				
15	<u>calendar</u> daya	after the person has been airborne <u>using</u> an aircraft <u>within the same area;</u> or					
16	(ii)	for the purpose of concentrating, pursuing, driving, rallying, or stirring up any	y game bird,				
17	migratory bird, game animal, or fur-bearing animal; or						
18	(c)	if in <u>or using</u> an aircraft , including a helicopter , spot or locate any game anin	nal or fur-bearing

In addition, the person, upon conviction or forfeiture of bond or bail, may 8 be subject to forfeiture of any current hunting, fishing, or trapping license issued by this state and the privilege 9 to hunt, fish, or trap in this state or to use state lands, as defined in 77-1-101, for recreational purposes for a 10 period of time set by the court.

11 (b) If a person is convicted or forfeits bond or bail after being charged with unlawful use of an

aircraft to kill or take a deer, elk, antelope, mountain lion, mountain sheep, moose, wild buffalo, caribou,
mountain goat, black bear, or grizzly bear, the person shall be fined not less than \$500 or more than \$2,000 or

be imprisoned in the county detention center for not more than 6 months, or both. In addition, the person shall forfeit any current hunting, fishing, recreational use, or trapping license issued by this state and the privilege to hunt, fish, or trap in this state for 30 months from the date of conviction or forfeiture unless the court imposes a

17 longer period.

18 (c) If a person is convicted or forfeits bond or bail after being charged with unlawful use of an 19 aircraft to kill or take a fur-bearing animal, the person shall be fined not less than \$100 or more than \$1,000 or 20 be imprisoned in the county detention center for not more than 6 months, or both. In addition, the person shall 21 forfeit any current hunting, fishing, recreational use, or trapping license issued by this state and the privilege to 22 hunt, fish, or trap in this state for 24 months from the date of conviction or forfeiture unless the court imposes a 23 longer period, and any pelts possessed unlawfully must be confiscated.
