Description of fiscal impact: SB 256 has no fiscal impact to the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC).

FISCAL ANALYSIS

Assumptions:

- Land in the state that is held by a foreign adversary government or foreign adversary nongovernment person will be transferred to an eligible entity to comply with statute by December 31, 2023.

Technical Notes:

- A comprehensive database of lands or property interests in the state that is held by a foreign adversary government or foreign adversary nongovernment person does not currently exist, and the DNRC has no other way of tracking this information.
- Currently there is no mechanism for the DNRC to know if a water rights customer is a citizen of an enemy state; the Water Resources Division would not be able to enforce the bill.
