PROPOSED PRICE FOR SESSION PROCEEDINGS 2017 SESSION

We need to increase the price that we charge lobbyists for legislative proceedings again this year, as our printing costs continue to rise. Last session printing costs went up to \$.048 per impression and this session they go up again to \$.051 per impression (each side of a page is an impression).

Based on the amount of printing last session, and the increase in price, I propose the following prices. The number of paid subscribers continues to decrease because of the availability on-line, but we still had 11 subscribers last session and that seems to be holding steady. This is in addition to the lobbyists and general public who purchase individual copies of bills as needed rather than the full set.

The cost of printing a complete set of bills has increased, due to the 6% increase in cost of printing. We are no longer offering status sheets as a subscription due to lack of demand, but will print status sheets for people as requested.

We did not need to increase the price of a set of journals, as they only cost us \$170 to print last session. Therefore, even with the 6% increase, \$180 should be adequate to cover the cost of printing.
