COMMITTEE ACTION

The Legislative Council adopted motions to:

- authorize staff to move forward with the Mindcentric contract for legislator emails, to archive emails for 5 years, to require a strong password, and to migrate the current mt.gov accounts to the Zimbra system, with the option of migrating other accounts at a later date:
- reauthorize Information Technology Reserve funds in the amount of \$485,616 to pay for the completion of the Bill Drafting Editor and System of the SSR and TVMT critical needs:
- authorized the expenditure of an additional \$514,384 from the Information Technology Reserve Account to pay for the completion of the Bill Drafting Editor and System of the SSR:
- direct staff to come up with some decision points regarding specific policy decisions that have been outlined in the briefing paper, "Sexual Harassment Prevention Training and Policies", and to include a training curriculum to the next Council meeting; and
- direct staff to work with Jeff Mangan, Commissioner of Political Practices, on a proposal
 of best practices in relation to lobbyists' participation in sexual harassment [prevention]
 training to the next Council meeting.
- Rep. Eck and Sen. Facey were appointed to a subcommittee to work with staff and Commissioner Mangan on sexual harassment policies and procedures.

legislators who currently use the mt.gov account over to Zimbra, and that during training and orientation, they would offer that service to new legislators as well as offering it to holdover senators who do not use the mt.gov account. The committee also discussed what happens to the emails when a legislator is termed out, is not re-elected to office, or does not run again with regards to archiving. Sen. Buttrey asked what the charges might be to archive 150

legislators' emails. Mr. McLean said that when a legislator is no longer serving, his email account is disabled but the archived emails will remain in the system.

That service is built into the price of Zimbra.
