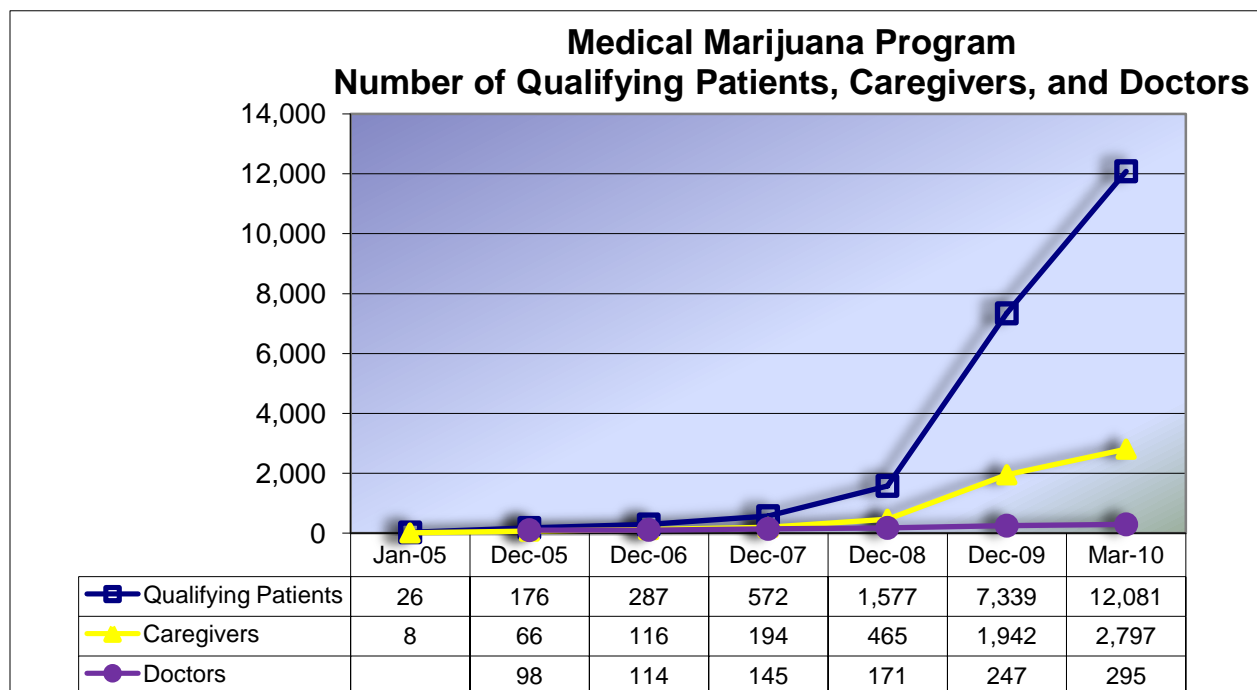

 INTERIM COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT
 MARCH 31, 2010

Pursuant to 50-46-103(9), MCA, the department shall report annually to the legislature the number of applications for registry identification cards, the number of qualifying patients and caregivers approved, the nature of the debilitating medical conditions of the qualifying patients, the number of registry identification cards revoked, and the number of physicians providing written certification for qualifying patients. The department may not provide any identifying information of qualifying patients, caregivers, or physicians.

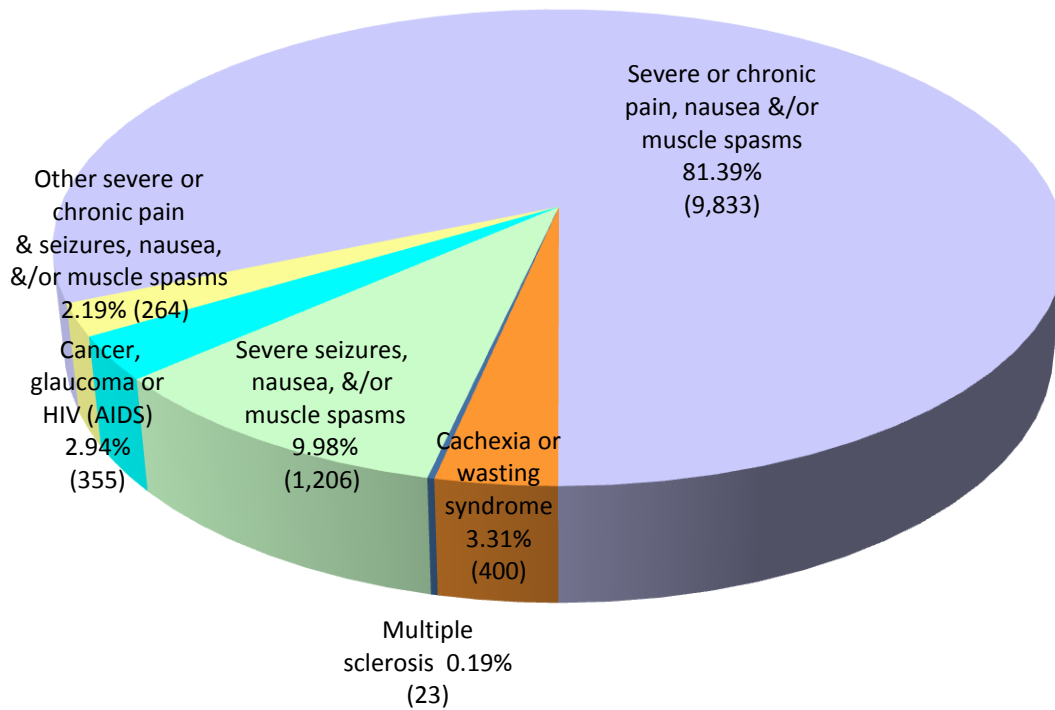
On January 21, 2005, the first Medical Marijuana Program (MMP) registry identification cards were issued to 26 qualifying patients and eight caregivers. Since the start of the program in November 2004, 12,640 patients have been approved. As of March 31, 2010, the following information is provided for the MMP:

- 12,081 qualifying patients
- 2,797 registered caregivers
- 22 minors
- 295 physicians providing written certification for qualifying patients
- 54 counties with qualifying patients
- 6 registry identification cards revoked
- 17 qualifying patients have died
- 559 qualifying patients have lapsed, (not renewed)



1,243 of the 2,797 caregivers have more than one qualifying patient. These 1,243 caregivers serve 10,527 qualifying patients or 87% of the registry's patients.

The chart above identifies the nature of the debilitating medical conditions per MCA 50-46-102 (2), of qualifying patients with current enrollment on the Medical Marijuana Registry, as of March 31, 2010.
