The following proposals were presented as discussion points for the Subcommittee:

Subcommittee Action followed by Adjournment

- 1. --codify a requirement that the professional assistance programs notify the appropriate board about their licensees who are participating in the program and their progress.
- 2. --distinguish in statute between participants in the nondisciplinary tracks (volunteer referral) and the disciplinary (possible legal infraction) tracks by using different program/board approaches for each.
- 3. --determine whether two strikes (or other number of strikes or failures to complete a program or stay clean) means a participant loses their license.
- 4. -- provide a statutory revocation of license upon a felony conviction or -- for those with prescription authority -- the revocation by the Drug Enforcement Agency of prescription authority
- 5. -- discuss requiring a recommendation for use of in-state auditors to monitor impairment programs.
