- 1. Please introduce yourself, identify your organization (if you are representing one), and explain why you are interested in interim zoning.
- 2. What do you see as the purpose of interim zoning?
- 3. Please provide a couple examples of emergency situations that you believe should prompt a board of county commissioners to propose an interim zoning district or interim zoning regulations in order to "promote the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare".
- 4. Other than including a protest provision (if you believe one is appropriate--see #4), does 76-2-206, MCA, need to be amended? Why?
- 5. Do you believe protest should be provided for when an interim zoning district or regulation is proposed? Should it mirror the protest provisions in 76-2-205 or should there be a different process when a board of county commissioners proposes interim zoning? What should that process be?
- 6. If you oppose providing for protest for interim zoning, do you have suggestions for compromise language or suggestions for some form of limited protest or protest with a short time limit?
- 7. Should the criteria for what constitutes an emergency be clarified?
- 8. Please explain your understanding of other mechanisms that a local government may employ in what may be considered an emergency situation to "promote the public health, safety, morals, and general welfare".
- 9. What is your understanding of "due process" and what constitutes a violation of due process rights?
- 10. Should a penalty be imposed on local governments that do not follow proper procedures when proposing or implementing interim zoning?
- 11. Do you believe case law has adequately clarified proper interim zoning processes and procedures?
- 12. If you could have an interim zoning bill drafted today that would accomplish your goals and provide (or enhance) clarity, what would it include?
