By Request of the Law and Justice Interim Committee

A Bill for an Act entitled: "An Act establishing the Corrections Advisory Council and establishing its purpose and duties."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Montana:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Corrections advisory council -membership -- purpose and duties. (1) There is a corrections
advisory council. The council is comprised of 10 members serving
1-year terms appointed as follows:

- (a) 6 members appointed by the governor to include:
- (i) a sheriff;
- (ii) a police chief;
- (iii) a prosecutor or deputy prosecutor;
- (iv) a public defender; and
- (v) 2 family members of an inmate; and
- (b) (i) two representatives, including one from each party, appointed by the speaker of the house; and
- (ii) two senators, including one from each party, appointed by the committee on committees.
 - (2) The council shall:
- (a) analyze current adult and juvenile offender population trends and develop long-term projections;
 - (b) determine the potential future infrastructure needs

necessary to increase capacity within the following community corrections and prison alternative programs in a way that keeps pace with anticipated growth during the next 10-15 years:

- (i) probation and parole;
- (ii) juvenile offenders;
- (iii) prerelease centers;
- (iv) substance-abuse treatment;
- (v) intensive supervision;
- (vi) mental health treatment; and
- (vii) revocation and sanction;
- (c) analyze the existing state-private partnerships being used to provide capacity in the corrections system and determine the ability of private, corporations to continue to fulfill this cooperative role with the state;
- (d) review and analyze the existing infrastructure at Montana state prison, the Montana women's prison, and other state-owned or state-contracted correctional facilities and make recommendations on future needs; and
- (e) report to the governor the results of its work and the recommendations it develops for managing Montana's growing offender population.
- (3)(a) A member of the council who is not a legislator or an employee of the state or a political subdivision of the state is eligible to be reimbursed and compensated, as provided in 2-15-124;
- (b) A member of the council who is not a legislator but is an employee of the state or a political subdivision of the state

is not entitled to compensation but is entitled to be reimbursed for expenses, as provided in 2-18-501 through 2-18-503; and

- (c) A legislator who is a member of the council is eligible to be compensated and reimbursed, as provided in 5-2-302.
- (4) The department of corrections shall provide administrative support as necessary to assist the council in its duties pursuant to this section.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. {standard} Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 53, chapter 1, part 2, and the provisions of Title 53, chapter 1, part 2, apply to [section 1].
