COMMITTEE ACTION

CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

- 00:00:02 Sen. Gillan, Acting Presiding Officer, called the meeting to order at 1:02 p.m. The committee secretary called roll. Sen. Peterson was excused.
- 00:02:50 The members of the committee introduced themselves.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

- 00:14:00 Sen. Tutvedt nominated Rep. Hollandsworth for chair. Rep. Miller **moved** to accept Rep. Hollandsworth as chair. The motion **passed** unanimously by voice vote.
- 00:15:09 Sen. Erickson nominated Sen. Kaufmann as vice chair. Rep. Barrett **moved** to accept Sen. Kaufmann as vice chair. The motion **passed** unanimously by voice vote.

- 00:18:03 Mr. Martin reviewed the agenda and actions that the committee needs to accomplish.

 - Road Repair Projects from Spring Flooding
- 00:22:36 Mr. Lynch gave a presentation on the damage to Montana's roads due to flooding (Exhibit 1).

Questions

- O0:49:52 Sen. Erickson asked about funding that might be available from the federal government. Director Lynch said that if there is no federal emergency funding available, the state would recover the costs through the state federal highway program or the state fund construction program.
- O0:53:48 Sen. Essmann asked about the problem with the grade structure on Interstate 90 near Crow Agency. Director Lynch said that those structures were set according to rules and according to a 100-year flood plain.
 - Highway Safety
- 00:57:36 Director Lynch gave a presentation (Exhibit 2) on highway safety.

Questions

- O1:34:33 Rep. Barrett asked whether any information was generated on the proper use of child restraint seats, whether the right kinds of seats were used, or whether they were being used at all. Director Lynch said that before legislation regarding child restraint seats was in place, the Department had a program that provided education on the safety issues of child restraint seats.
- O1:36:27 Sen. Kaufmann asked if there is any information on tracking cell phone usage and if the cell phone usage is related to accidents. Director Lynch said that it is hard to track whether or not an accident happened as a result of someone using their cell phones.
- O1:38:17 Sen. Kaufmann asked about the gender breakdown on DUI crashes and fatalities. Director Lynch said it is close to 60% male and 40% female.
- O1:39:04 Sen. Erickson asked about data on crashes involving motorcycles and whether helmets were worn. Director Lynch said that he would provide that information to Sen. Erickson.

Lawsuit on Imperial Oil Transport

O1:40:22 Director Lynch gave an update on the Imperial Oil Transport lawsuit that was filed against the Montana Department of Transportation.

Questions

- O1:42:26 Sen. Erickson asked if Director Lynch had answered the set of questions that were sent (Exhibit 3) to the Department of Transportation regarding whether analyses would be conducted on the bridges located on the route. Director Lynch said that most of the questions were dealt with in the environmental document, but he would look into it further.
- O1:45:34 Sen. Kaufmann asked about communications or conversations that the Department may have had with the Federal Highway Department regarding any involvement in the debate about the transport. Director Lynch said the federal department knows about the project, but it is not involved in the decision-making.
- O1:51:07 Sen. Essmann discussed the project near Billings that involves hauling gravel and topsoil into the median between the east bound and west bound lanes of Interstate 90. He asked Director Lynch why that project is being done and what is its purpose. Director Lynch said that he thinks that they are putting in cable barrier instead of the typical guard rail.
- O1:53:29 Rep. Malek asked about the Idaho Department of Transportation using software to analyze weight bearing capacity of their bridges and does Montana have that software capacity. Director Lynch discussed how the state analyzes its bridges for weight bearing capacity.

01:59:03 **Zack Porter, All Against the Haul, Missoula, Montana**, commented on Director Lynch's presentation, specifically the process of analyzing bridge capacity.

- 02:05:34 **Spook Stang, Executive Vice President, Motor Carriers of Montana**, said that 67% of the Montana people approve of this project and 90% think that the Department of Transportation does an adequate job.
- 02:07:31 **Susan Estep, Missoula, Montana**, told the committee that comments and concerns were forward to Mr. Lynch from an Idaho citizen regarding bridge load weights.

He requested that the Department of Revenue provide a report on the issue of tax havens on a timely basis this interim.

- 02:52:37 Rep. Barrett commented on the three concerns he has: the adequacy of the tax incidence criterion, whether the deductions, exclusions, exemptions, and credits are meeting their intended purposes, and whether exemptions, deductions, and credits affect tax incidence by income class.
- O2:57:29 Sen. Essmann said that he would like to study trends that are occurring in other states that have an income tax and whether steps are being taken to make the tax systems more complex or less complex.
- O2:59:41 Sen. Erickson commented on the timing set aside for each study and the kinds of data the committee is getting. He is interested in how often people use specific tax credits.
- 03:01:59 Sen. Kaufmann said that she agrees with Sen. Essmann that this is the kind of study where the solutions may not come easy but the information that the committee receives may be beneficial in terms of understanding income taxes in Montana.
