# Fast Facts

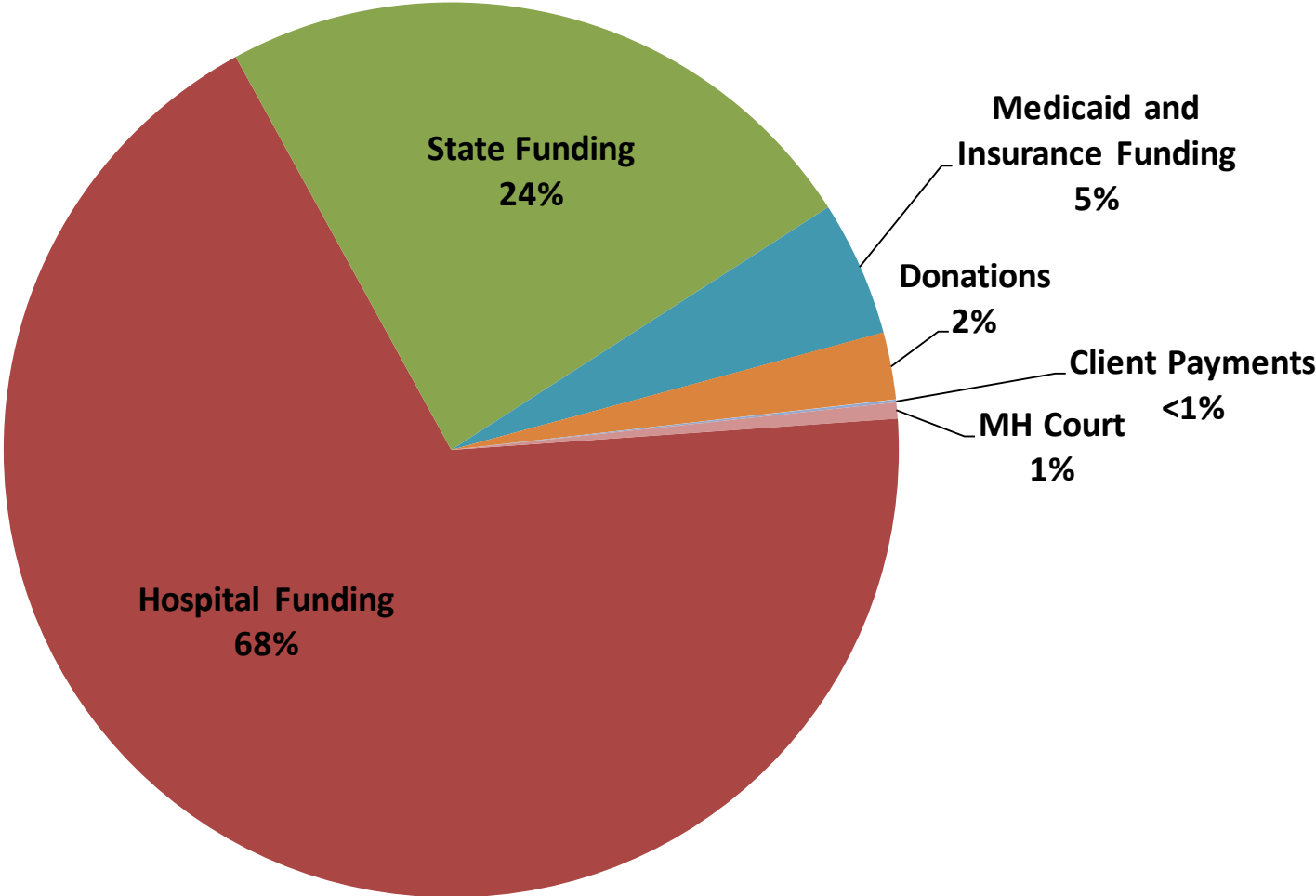
- **620 - 700 clients/month**

- **79% homeless or at-risk of homelessness**

- **44 Montana counties served**

- Access to Recovery services for Native Americans

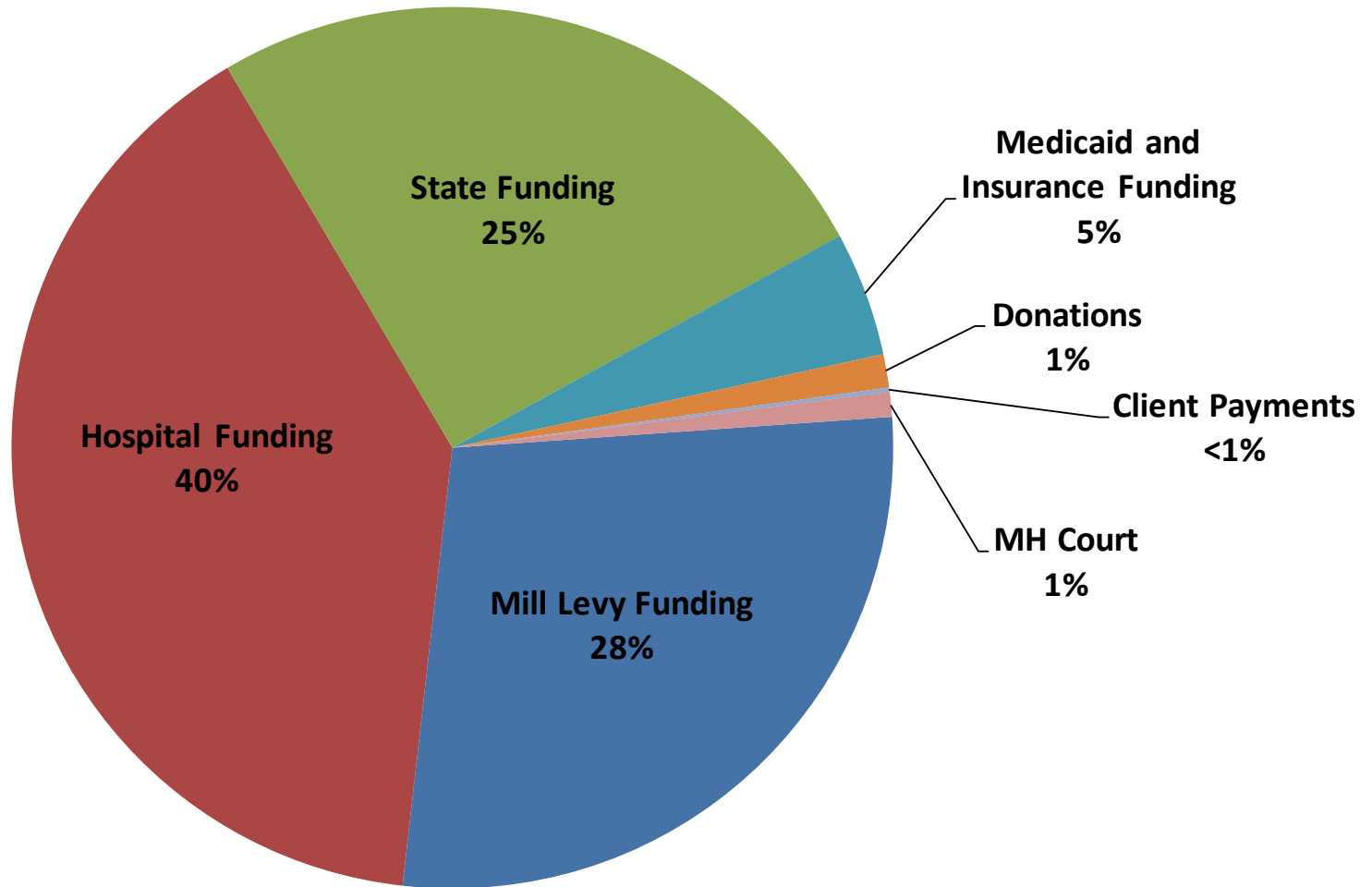
# Community Crisis Center Funding 2010-2011

\$1,232,987



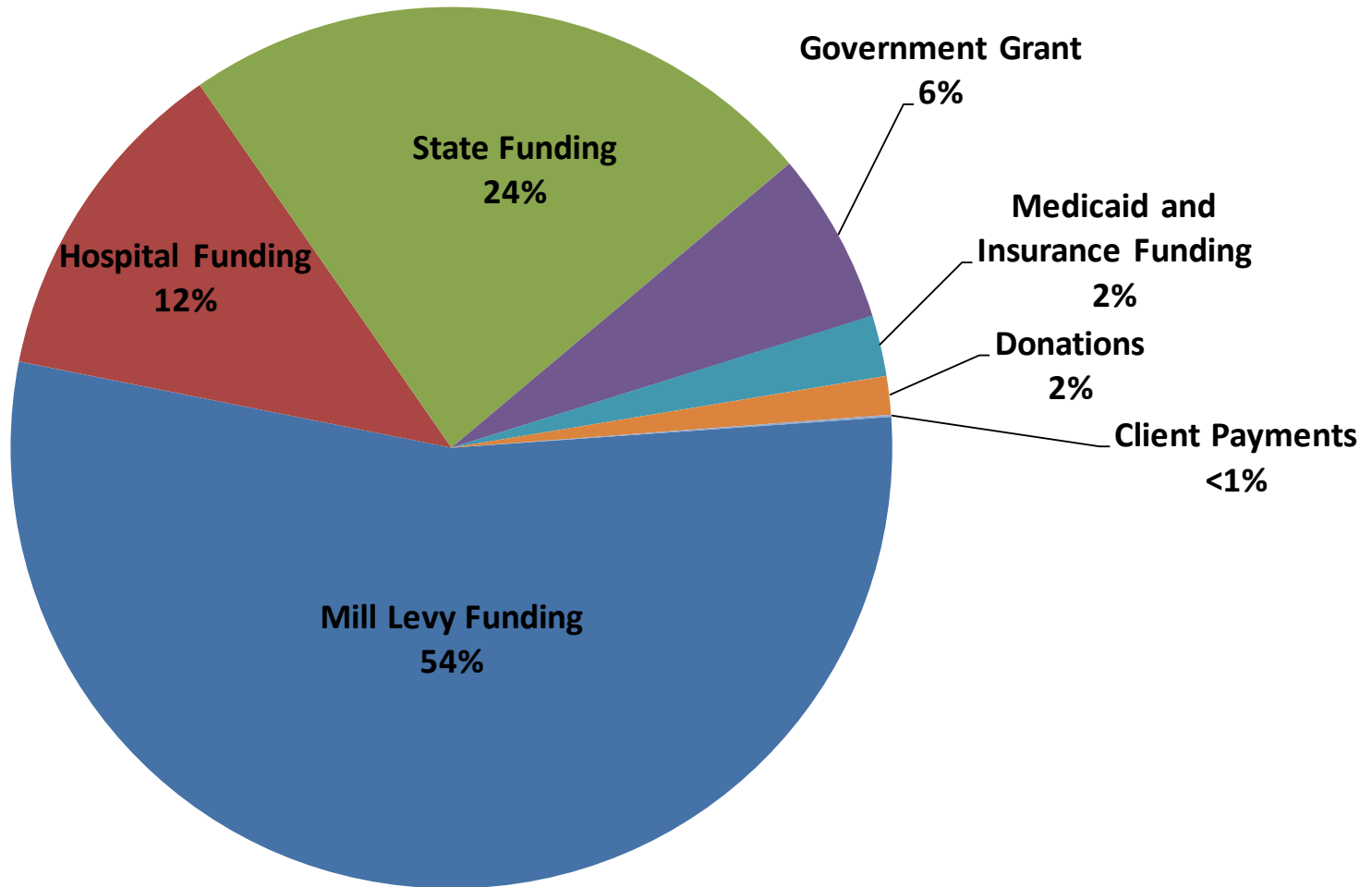
# Community Crisis Center Funding 2011-2012
