- Approximately 1400 individuals


Pre-release centers (approximately 800) AND Probation/Parole (approximately 10,000)

- The clinical services division IS NOT responsible for oversight and payment for medical, dental, vision, and mental health services provided at Pre-Release Centers or those individuals on probation or parole
- Many of these individuals are eligible for medical coverage through Medicaid Expansion

Minnesota Multistate Contracting Alliance for Pharmacy (MMCAP) and Diamond Pharmacy


- DOC along with other state agencies contract with MMCAP for the provision of medications
- This is a coalition of states formed to maximize Rx costs and reduce administrative costs
- Medication costs are negotiated through MMCAP
- Medications are ordered and received from Diamond Pharmacy

DOC PRESCRIPTION EXPENDITURES 2012 - 2017




Therapeutic Class Prescriptions




5 Year Drug Inflation Rate by Fluctuation Percentage - Top 10 Medications



What are we doing to combat costs

- Created a pain management committee to review all offenders on pain medications to ensure the current CDC guidelines are being followed
- Working with Mountain Pacific Quality Health on pre-authorization process for treatment of Hep C to ensure offenders are screened and meet criteria for treatment
- Working with hospitals/clinics to provide out-reach services for specialty needs (cardiology, orthopedics, nephrology)

Ideas:

- Explore joining Louisiana's Health Secretary to encourage federal government involved in reducing the price of Hep C treatment
- Explore state-owned pharmacy
 - Collaborate with University of Montana's School of Pharmacy to create a state pharmacy?
