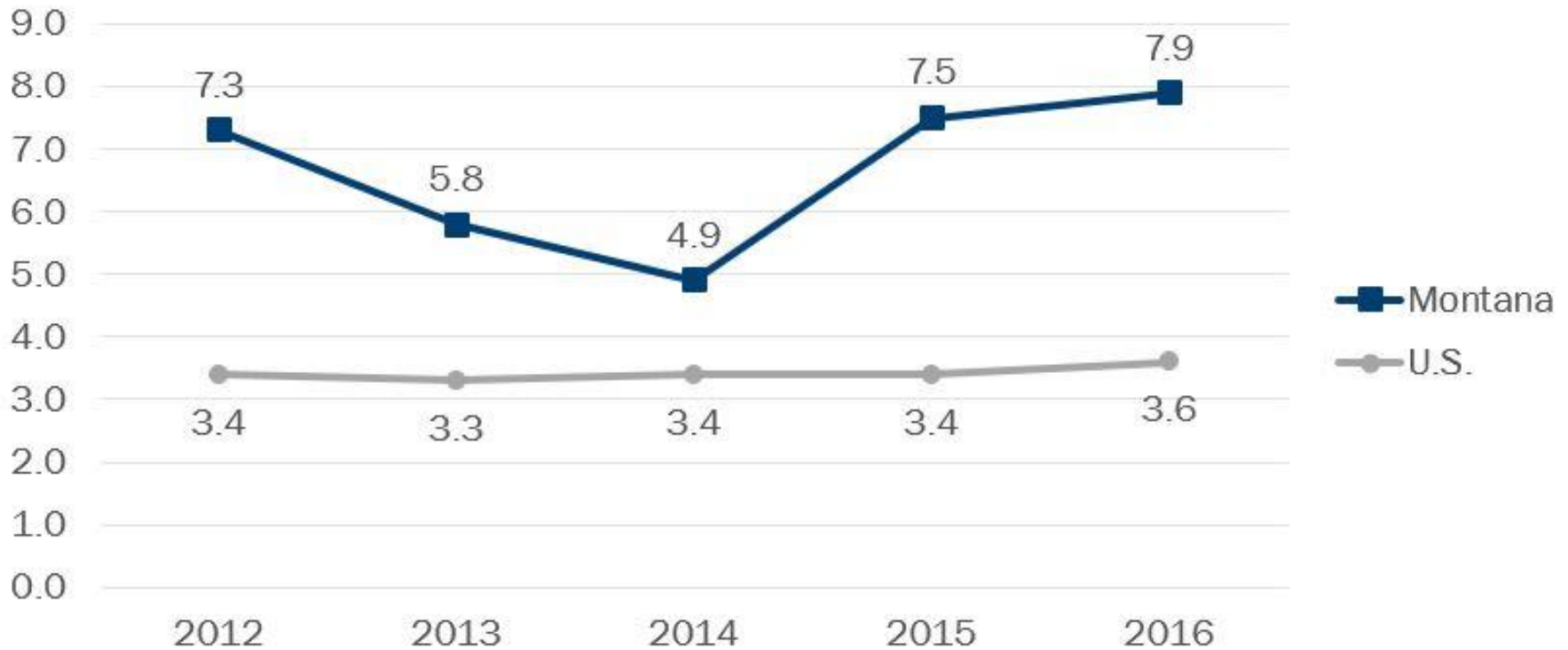

# Fatal Injury Rates

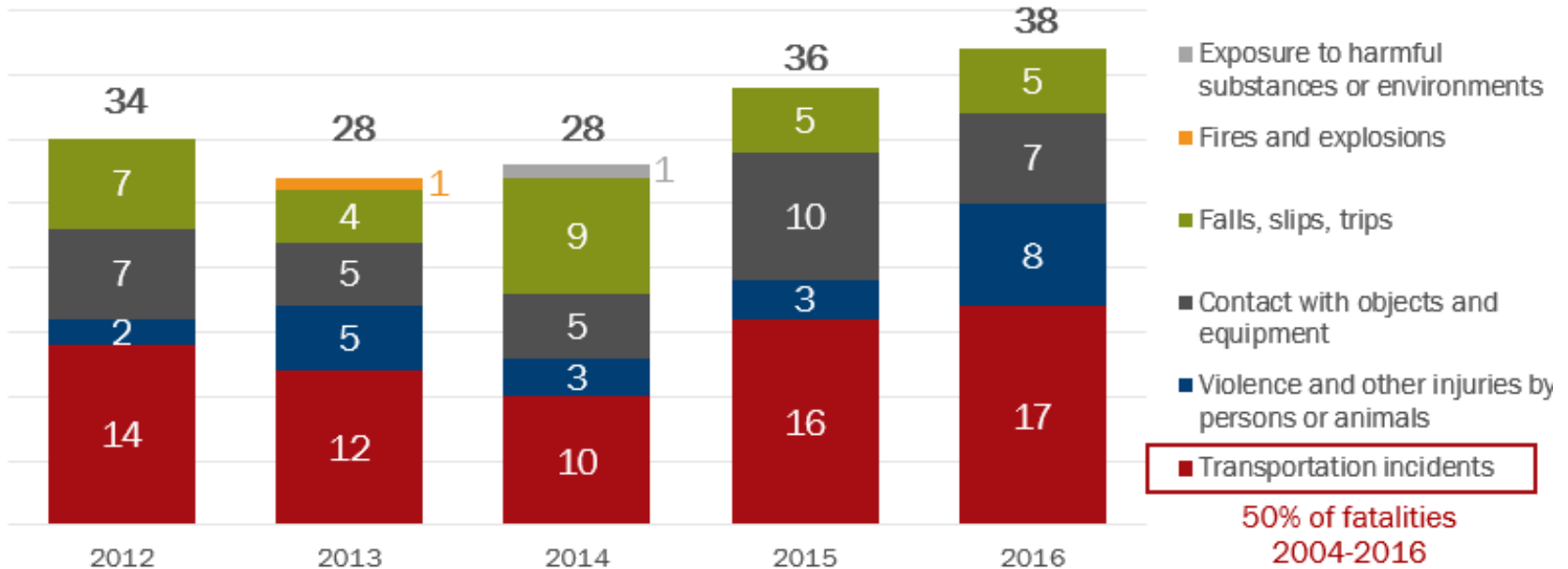
Work-Related Fatalities per 100,000 Full-Time Workers

Work-Related Fatalities by Event or Exposure

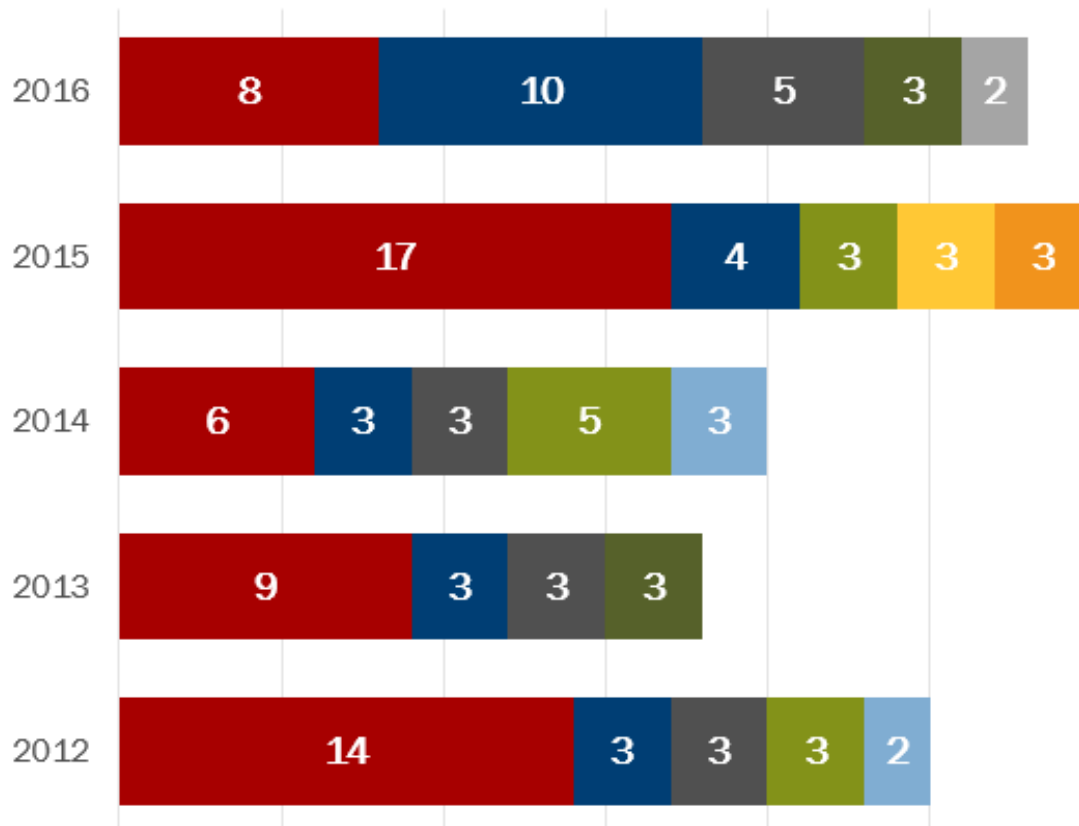


**50%** of all worker deaths in Montana were **transportation-related** incidents from 2004-2016.

- Workers age 55 and up
- Agricultural industry (ATVs)

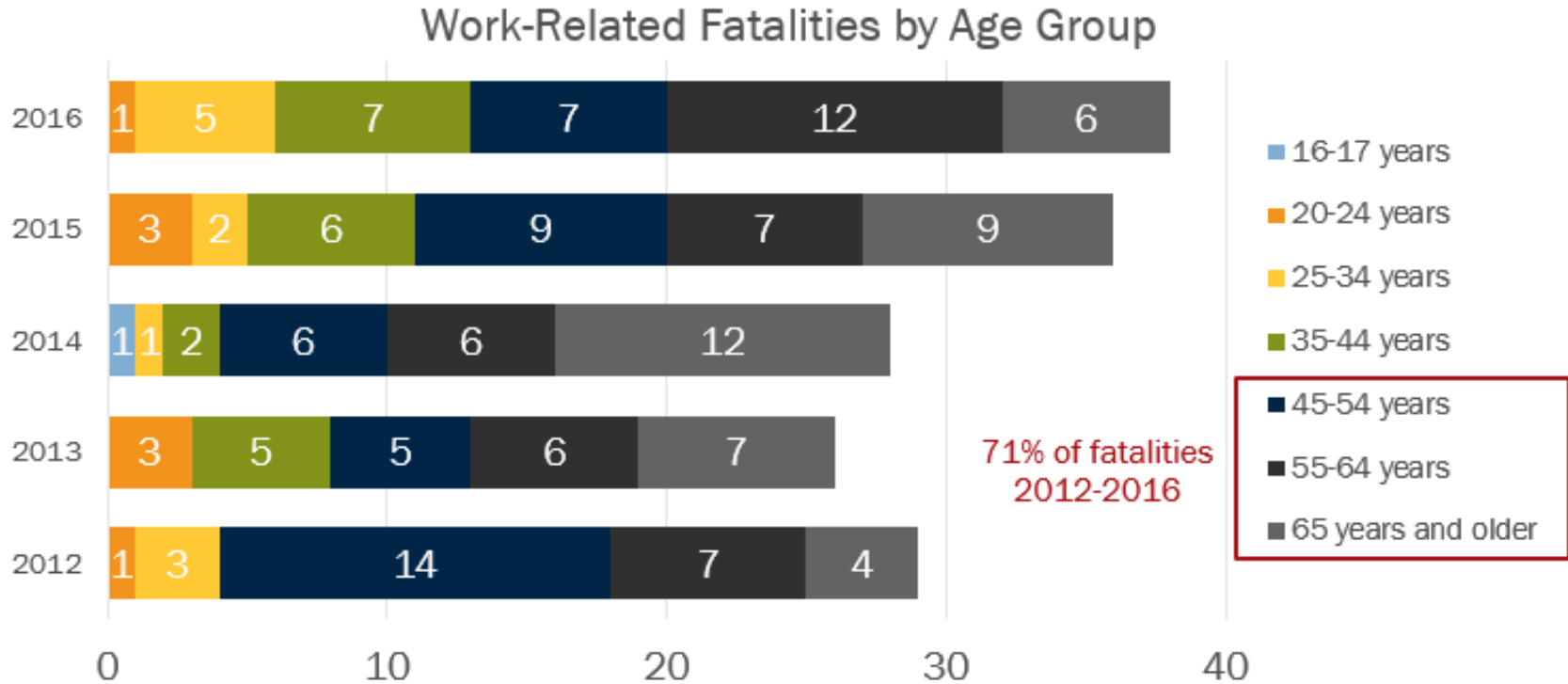
# Fatalities by Industry

Top Industries with Highest Number of Fatalities, by Year



Notes: Counts may not add up to annual totals. Excluded: Industries with 1 fatality.

# Fatalities by Age Group



Workers age 45 and up: 71% of fatalities from 2012-2016

- Workers age 55 and up: 46% of fatalities
- **Transportation incidents and falls/slips/trips**

# What areas can we target to prevent work-related fatalities in Montana?

- Transportation-related fatalities
- Workers age 55 and up
- Industries: Agriculture & Construction
- Small businesses face unique challenges
