SUBJECT: TANF Parents as Scholars SFY 2022 Report

## **Overview:**

During the 2011 Legislative session, Senate Bill 385 created the Parents as Scholars Program (PAS) and is codified in 53-4-209, MCA. This statute allows select cash recipients of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) to attend an approved vocational/educational program for a period that is longer than the allowable 12-month time limit under Federal Regulation (45 CFR 261.33). This supports TANF cash recipients in the full-time pursuit of education, with attendance in High School Equivalency Test (HiSET) certificates, associate degree, or baccalaureate degree programs.

## **SFY 2022 Outcomes:**

- Nine individuals benefited from the PAS program in SFY 2022
  - Eight Single parents
  - One Two-parent
- Average number of children: 2
- Three individuals completed their education goal through TANF
  - Associates: Human Services (1)
  - Bachelors: Social Work (2)
- Two individuals are continuing in the program
- Four individuals did not complete their educational goal through PAS
  - Sanction/failure to comply (1)
  - Gained employment, closed TANF (1)
  - Case closed due to no TANF redetermination (2)

## **Success Stories:**

Graduating with my bachelors degree was always a dream of mine that didn't seem possible.
