





5 YEAR COMPARISON OF ADMISSIONS BY PROGRAM TYPE





Care Campus Admissions By Race/Origin September 26, 2018, to May 31, 2023

September 26, 2018, to May 31, 2023






CARE CAMPUS PROGRAM UTIL IZATION BY LAW ENFORCEMENT













CHARGES DIVERTED BY LAW ENFORCEMENT TO CARE CAMPUS PROGRAMS September 26, 2018, to May 31, 2023



ALTERNATIVES TO INCARCERATION THROUGH THE UTILIZATION OF CARE CAMPUS PROGRAMS

POLICE

Rapid City Police Department: \$150 per detainment



Pennington County Jail: \$85 per day



Pennington County-States Attorney's Office-\$25 per misdemeanor file prosecuted



Pennington County Public Defender's Office \$450 per misdemeanor file defended



Pennington County Court House: \$86.50 expenses factored for misdemeanor files at present time




\$796.50 per individual jail diversion x 4,660 admissions diverted to Care Campus Programs = \$3,711,690

*53 individuals were not assigned a program type and are not reflected in this chart.

*32 individuals were referred to Residential treatment and are not reflected in this chart.

- Detoxification costs (\$226 per day/24hour period) x 4.039 admissions = \$912.814
- Safe Solutions costs (\$25 per day/ 24-hour period) x 541 admissions = \$13,525
- Crisis Care Center costs (\$131 per day/24-hour period) x 47 admissions =




