WHO WE ARE

STEP has been collaborating with people in order to deepen their capacity to pursue the growth and change they seek for more than **47 years**, providing community-based services to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) and people in recovery from substance use disorders. STEP serves over 120 people and families per month.

Since 2019, STEP has operated Renewal Recovery Residences, certified by **Recovery Access Montana**. The program includes six recovery homes serving more than 40 individuals, including men, women, and pregnant and postpartum women with children. These residences provide safe, structured housing that supports stability, accountability, and successful transitions into their community. The people in our homes have an average length of stay of over **300 days**.

STEP recovery services maintain a **Net Promoter Score of 100%** and a **Social Model of Recovery score of 80%** or higher, reflecting high resident and referral satisfaction.

In 2025, STEP strengthened sustainability of its Recovery Residences by expanding into-

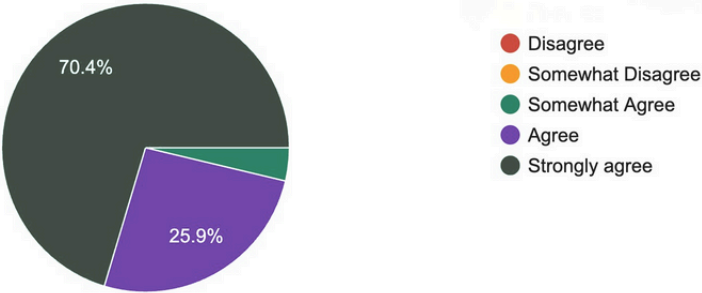
