

Summary of Law and Justice Legislation from the 2025 Legislative Session

INTRODUCTION

The 2025 Legislature considered numerous bills related to law and justice topics. This document summarizes those bills, excluding any provisions in House Bill 2: General Appropriation Act.

The first section of this summary provides an overview of the outcome of bills requested by the 2023-2024 Law and Justice Interim Committee. Enacted legislation related to the topic is listed in the second section of this summary. Each bill summary is headed by the bill number and chapter number is hyperlinked in the electronic version. COMMITTEE REQUESTED BILLS

The committee requested six bills for the 2025 legislative session. Of those requested, four bills have been passed and approved, and signed by the governor. Two of the six failed in the legislative process.

PASSED THE 2025 LEGISLATIVE BODY

- 1. <u>House Bill 32/Ch. 6</u> (LC0316 / LJIC PD 1): An act revising the circumstances in which a government entity may make an audio or video recording of a child without obtaining parental consent.
- 2. <u>House Bill 44/Ch. 24</u> (LC0320 / LJIC PD 7): An act establishing a penalty for tampering with or fabricating physical evidence in connection with a homicide.
- 3. <u>Senate Bill 19/Ch. 583</u> (LC0317 / LJIC PD 2): An act generally revising sentencing laws and raising the penalty thresholds for offenses involving theft, failure to return rented of leased personal property, issuing a bad check, deceptive practices, forgery, and theft of identity.
- 4. <u>Senate Bill 91/Ch. 551</u> (LC0319 / LJIC PD 6): An act requiring driver's licenses and identification cards to display citizenship status.

FAILED TO PASS

- 1. <u>House Bill 93</u> (LC0318 / LJIC PD 4): An act providing compensation for people who have been wrongly convicted of felony crimes and exonerated.
- 2. <u>Senate Joint Resolution 2</u> (LC0321 / LJIC PD 8): A joint resolution of the Senate and House of Representatives of the state of Montana to disapprove of the rules of practice and procedure adopted by the Montana Supreme Court.



LAW AND JUSTICE-RELATED ENACTED LEGISLATION

The enacted legislation is categorized as follows: alcohol and drugs, civil procedure, corrections, crimes and criminal procedure, estates and trusts, family law and minors, guns and weapons, interim studies, judges and justices/courts, law enforcement, and privacy. Although a bill may fit into more than one topic, it is listed only once.

ALCOHOL AND DRUGS

- 1. House Bill 41/Ch. 7: An act adding gabapentin to the drugs listed in Schedule V controlled substances.
- 2. <u>House Bill 196/Ch. 111</u>: An act revising alcohol server and sales training to include training related to digital identification cards; including digital identification cards as a prohibited form of fraudulent identification.
- 3. <u>House Bill 249/Ch. 115</u>: An act revising digital identification laws; including digital versions of licenses in alcohol, tobacco, and marijuana laws.
- 4. House Bill 267/Ch. 226: An act creating the crime of aggravated vehicular homicide while under influence.
- 5. <u>House Bill 344/Ch. 264</u>: An act creating an additional type of driving under the influence offense regarding noncommercial or commercial drivers who have a certain amount of prohibited substances other than alcohol or marijuana in their blood.
- 6. House Bill 467/Ch. 298: An act including the use of oral fluid for DUI testing.
- 7. <u>House Bill 626/Ch. 702</u>: An act revising DUI sentencing when a person has a pending or subsequent offense while awaiting sentencing on a present offense.
- 8. <u>Senate Bill 132/Ch. 155</u>: An act creating separate crimes for minor in possession or unlawful attempt to purchase alcohol, marijuana, or other intoxicating substances.
- 9. <u>Senate Bill 201/Ch. 367</u>: An act revising cleanup laws for properties contaminated with methamphetamines or fentanyl.
- 10. <u>Senate Bill 375/Ch. 394</u>: An act prohibiting the sale of hemp products that contain THC to consumers; providing definitions; and providing an immediate effective date.
- 11. <u>Senate Bill 508/Ch. 412</u>: An act providing that any level of tetrahydrocannabinol constitutes driving under the influence for drivers under 21 years of ages.

- 2. <u>House Bill 292/Ch. 250</u>: An act establishing the Uniform Public Expression Protection Act.
- 3. <u>House Bill 324/Ch. 257</u>: An act revising legislative policy for voluntary payments to include all claims; providing that certain bad faith insurance actions do not apply to voluntary payments.
- 4. <u>House Bill 409/Ch. 20</u>: An act prohibiting a court from using certain tests when considering an application for a preliminary injunction or a temporary restraining order.
- 5. <u>House Bill 521/Ch. 315</u>: An act providing that a person convicted of a crime who is injured during the commission of the crime has no right of action.
- 6. <u>House Bill 682/Ch. 709</u>: An act providing a statute of limitations for tort actions involving gender transition treatment on minors; providing for reciprocal coverage of detransition treatment in private insurance and



- public employee and Montana university system insurance plans; providing that detransition treatment be included as a service under Medicaid and Healthy Montana Kids in certain situations.
- 7. <u>House Bill 940/Ch. 662</u>: An act prohibiting overnight camping and storage of personal property on a state highway right-of-way.
- 8. <u>Senate Bill 38/Ch. 352</u>: An act revising laws to prohibit attorney fee awards against a government entity relating to legislative veto overrides.
- 9. <u>Senate Bill 39/Ch. 542</u>: An act requiring that certain awards of attorney fees must be reasonable.
- 10. Senate Bill 97/Ch. 357: An act revising venue laws for cases in which parties challenge recently enacted law.
- 11. <u>Senate Bill 143/Ch. 174</u>: An act revising laws relating to commencement of actions based on contract, covenant, obligation, or liability founded on an instrument; revising laws relating to commencement of actions for damages arising out of work on improvements to real property or land surveying.

- 3. <u>House Bill 82/Ch. 102</u>: An act creating the offense of grooming of a child for a sexual offense, revising the offense of sexual abuse of children to include computer-generated child pornography, and adding the offense of grooming a child for a sexual offense to the definition of sexual offense.
- 4. <u>House Bill 117/Ch. 669</u>: An act establishing criminal justice data warehouse project priorities for the 2025-2026 interim.
- 5. <u>House Bill 214/Ch. 113</u>: An act providing for the prosecution of state crimes against persons that are subject to federal immigration detention.
- 6. <u>House Bill 268/Ch. 117</u>: An act requiring the county attorney to notify the attorney general's office when a petition to relieve duty to register is filed.
- 7. <u>House Bill 354/Ch. 446</u>: An act requiring the revocation of hunting, fishing, and trapping privileges for acts of criminal trespass committed while hunting, fishing, trapping, or collecting or attempting to collect antlers, antler sheds, or animal horns.
- 8. <u>House Bill 401/Ch. 276</u>: An act prohibiting the manufacture for sale, sale, holding, or offering for sale, or distribution of cell-cultured edible product.
- 9. <u>House Bill 446/Ch. 657</u>: An act providing the exposure of a person's intimate parts in a public place to members of the opposite sex or the opposite sex observed at birth to the person constitutes indecent exposure.
- 10. <u>House Bill 514/Ch. 686</u>: An act generally revising laws related to violating privacy in communications; expanding offenses to include obtaining money or valuables from a person; adding the act of possessing and threatening to disclose real or digitally fabricated media as a violation.
- 11. <u>House Bill 532/Ch. 484</u>: An act providing for a crime of abuse, neglect, or exploitation of incapacitated persons and vulnerable adults.
- 12. <u>House Bill 545/Ch. 659</u>: An act revising the name, membership, and duties of the missing indigenous persons task force.
- 13. <u>House Bill 575/Ch. 690</u>: An act authorizing that a court may assign a public defender for a parent in a proceeding to involuntarily terminate the parent's parental rights; providing that a court may order assignment of a public defender to serve as a member of a treatment court team.
- 14. <u>House Bill 578/Ch. 463</u>: An act removing from consideration an offender's financial resources when sentencing restitution.
- 15. <u>House Bill 612/Ch. 324</u>: An act providing if a sentence is revoked the new sentence must run consecutively to any existing sentence unless the original sentence ran concurrently.
- 16. <u>House Bill 625/Ch. 327</u>: An act providing for a reduction in a county's entitlement share if the county fails to comply with mandatory child abuse or neglect reporting requirements.
- 17. <u>House Bill 712/Ch. 509</u>: An act requiring a person convicted of the offense of vehicular homicide while under the influence to pay restitution for the support of each minor child whose parent or guardian was the victim of the offense.
- 18. House Bill 726/Ch. 473: An act revising surety bail bond insurance qualifications and continuing education.
- 19. <u>House Bill 743/Ch. 523</u>: An act requiring the Department of Public Health and Human Services to forward materials pertaining to an alleged offense of exploitation of an incapacitated person or vulnerable adult to



- the county attorney, and requiring each county attorney and the Department of Public Health and Human Services to report to the Attorney General.
- 20. <u>House Bill 752/Ch. 525</u>: An act prohibiting content providers from allowing access to child sexual abuse material in Montana.
- 21. <u>Senate Bill 25/Ch. 541</u>: An act regulating the use of deepfakes in election communications and electioneering communications.
- 22. <u>Senate Bill 101/Ch. 179</u>: An act creating the offense of unlawful squatting; creating the offense of fraudulent sale or lease of property.
- 23. <u>Senate Bill 154/Ch. 361</u>: An act revising the prohibition of the sale or purchase of human body parts under the revised uniform anatomical gift act.
- 24. <u>Senate Bill 261/Ch. 143</u>: An act establishing that a person commits the offense of endangering the welfare of children by exposing a child to marijuana or dangerous drugs or assisting a child in entering an adult-use dispensary or a place where human trafficking or the production of dangerous drugs is taking place.
- 25. <u>Senate Bill 280/Ch. 141</u>: An act allowing the Montana board of crime control to provide domestic violence intervention program grants to communities to monitor compliance with court-ordered requirements for offenders convicted of or charged with certain offenses.
- 26. <u>Senate Bill 282/Ch. 382</u>: An act generally revising search and seizure laws related to the ability of the state and local government to obtain and use electronic communications and related material and stored data of an electronic device.
- 27. <u>Senate Bill 296/Ch. 566</u>: An act establishing an enhanced penalty for a person employed or volunteering in a caregiving facility who is found guilty of an offense against a vulnerable person in that caregiving facility.
- 28. <u>Senate Bill 300/Ch. 568</u>: An act providing the offense of harassment or harm of a service animal, and providing the offense of unauthorized control of a service animal.
- 29. <u>Senate Bill 348/Ch. 602</u>: An act providing that offenders who commit a second offense of sexual assault must register as a sexual offender.
- 30. Senate Bill 413/Ch. 606: An act creating the crime of disclosing explicit synthetic media.
- 31. <u>Senate Bill 429/Ch. 607</u>: An act generally revising laws related to determination and restoration of fitness in criminal proceedings.

- 4. House Bill 352/Ch. 265: An act generally revising laws related to the Montana child support guidelines.
