

BLUE ENVELOPE PROGRAM



Purpose & Overview

- A voluntary initiative designed to support drivers with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
 during traffic stops and interactions with police officers while operating a motor vehicle.
- Featuring a specially designed blue envelope that holds essential documents—driver's license and vehicle's registration, while also offering communication guidelines for law enforcement and individuals with ASD on the envelope's exterior.
- Developed through a collaboration between the Massachusetts State Police,
 Massachusetts Chiefs of Police Association, Advocates for Autism of Massachusetts,
 The Arc of Massachusetts, and input from individuals on the autism spectrum and their families

Goals & Benefits

- Significantly reduce anxiety and potential stress for drivers with ASD during traffic stops
- Provides law enforcement with practical communication strategies and enables a smoother and more effective interaction.
- Encourages preparedness in drivers and their families, offering confidence and clarity during stops

How to Obtain & Prepare the Envelope

- Envelopes are available for free. You can request one in-person at a State Police barracks, most local Police Departments or via an **online** form to have it mailed directly.
- After receiving the envelope:
 - 1. Insert a copy of your driver's license (photocopy) and vehicle registration.
 - 2. Attach it in an accessible location (e.g., sun visor) for easy presentation.
 - 3. Keep documents inside updated
