Agency Bills that Passed (4)

Bill#	Short Title
HB 53	Revise law allowing for troop labor to execute projects
HB 66	Adopt most recent federal military codes and regulations
HB 72	Revise enlisted militia compensation for State Active Duty
HB 81	Revise law to change supervision of veterans' affairs division administrator

68th Legislative Session Update



HB₂

- Increase of 1 HR FTE
- Funding for implementing multi-factor authentication (MFA) on DMA's secondary non-state network. This will greatly enhance security and brings DMA into compliance with State cybersecurity policy.
- Increase of 3 Admin Assistants to support Veteran Service Offices
- Increase of 3 Case Managers for MT Youth Challenge
- Converted 11 modified positions to permanent in the Montana Veterans Affairs Division
- Added operational costs for State Veteran's Cemeteries

Study Bills:

- HJ 56 study resolution of search and rescue services and funding
 - DES administers reimbursement for search and rescue operations

 - 27M for long range building projects (LRBP)
 - SMART Deferred Maintenance Program Statewide 1.5M

 - MT State Veterans Cemetery, Interment Processing Center 600K
 - 40K Operations and Maintenance for existing facilities




Montana Veteran Affairs Division

State Partnership Program



- Montana National Guard has partnerships with 4 nations:
 - Kyrgyzstan since 1996
 - Turkmenistan since 2021
 - Sri Lanka since 2021
 - Maldives since 2022
- The State Partnership Program (SPP) conducts 40+ security cooperation events annually across two combatant commands.
- The SPP is lead planner and implementor for several Component Command (3-star command) exercises. Black Marlin in Maldives (May)

Montana Air National Guard



120th Airlift Wing

- 8 C-130H Hercules converting to 8 C-130J models beginning in Oct 2025 with first A/C arriving in spring 2026
- Currently deployed to AFRICOM with 152 personnel and 4 C-130H Aircraft
- Operating at 99% end strength: 835 of 846 Airman assigned
- Missions: Tactical Airlift, Aeromedical, Natural disaster relief, wildland firefighting

• 219th REDHORSE

- Construction and Engineering
 - Horizontal (Asphalt / Concrete)
 - Vertical (Structural construction)
- DRBS Disaster Relief Bed-Down Set
- Operating at 112% end strength at 140 personnel assigned with a projected increase to 178 by FY27
- \$70mil Military Construction project programmed to support construction of a new compound on base
