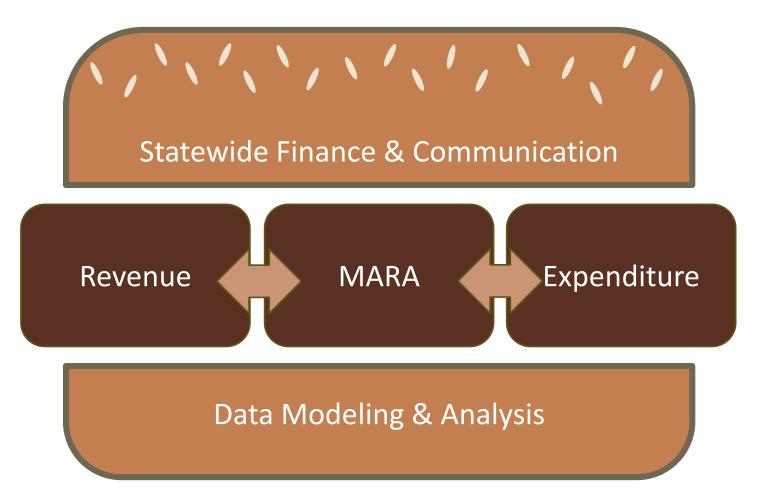

Expenditure Goal

Excellent staff guidance, communication, and assistance to Legislature in the budget development process during session requires well trained staff with experience. Currently the LFD has a higher proportion of new staff due to the new positions added.

- Refine a comprehensive program to train new staff by September 1, 2025 – present at the September 2025 LFC meeting
- Lower number of new analysts going into the 2027 session currently 6 of 13 expenditure analysts do not have session experience: goal of 3 or less new analysts

MARA Responsibilities

MARA's statutory role is to study the "long-term future budget and revenue needs of the state" and to "create data sets and models for future analysis by the legislature" – this role extends beyond the LFD and appropriating committees

To be successful, the committee and its products need to be understood and hopefully utilized by all legislators and legislative staff

MARA is a venue for hearing from a broad array of national policy experts, with a goal of informing long-term policy optimization and the questions the legislature should ask – and the associated data to gather

MARA data team continues to add components of the MARA study with forecasts- extending long-term thinking to additional policy areas

MARA projects and staff expertise support the quantitative needs of other projects and partners, like the decennial school funding study

MARA Goals – report to MARA

Goal 1 – Engagement with the legislature

- Attendance at MARA meetings by legislators increases by 15% relative to the 2025 biennium
- Engagement with other interim committees (citations by, speaking to, or projects for) increases by 15% relative to the 2025 biennium

Goal 2 – Continue to expand the depth and breadth of the MARA model

- Increase the number of modules within the MARA model to extend long-term thinking to additional policy areas – for example local government forecast
- Deepen the analysis of existing modules in response to legislative questions

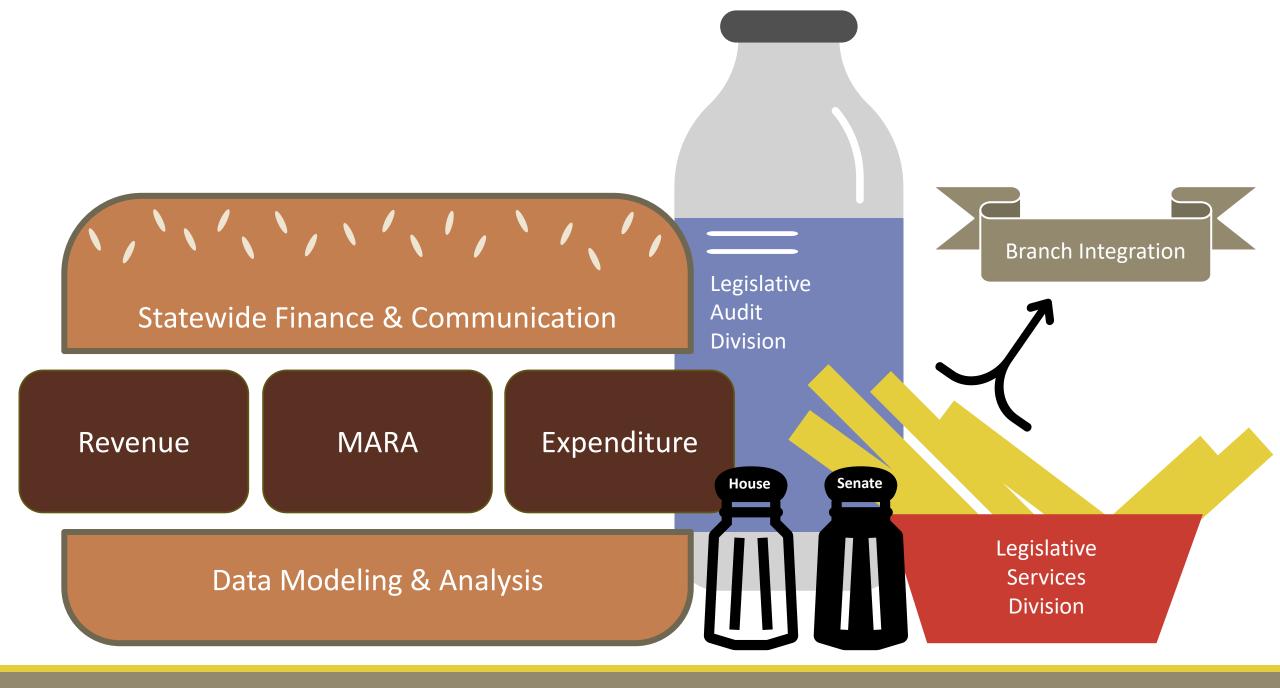

Create a data management plan that incorporates data management best practices defined by DAMA-DMBOK by September 1, 2025 and review the plan with MARA

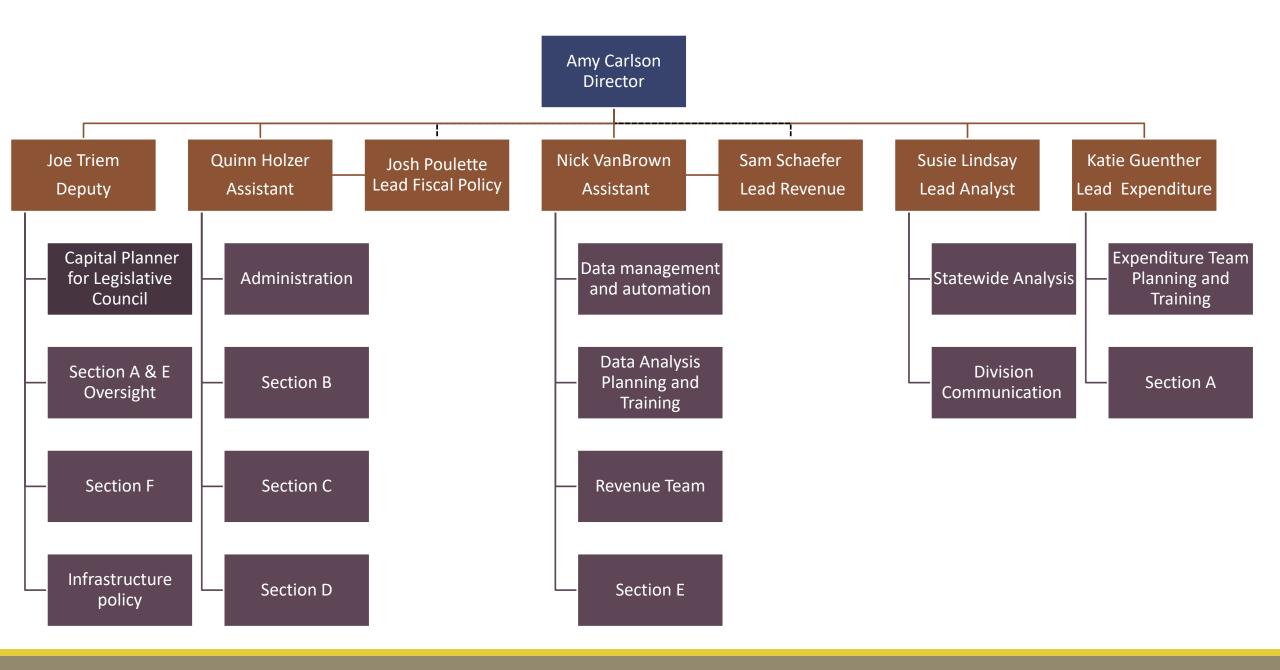


Branch-wide Coordination Responsibilities Collaboratively work with other G5 members to
