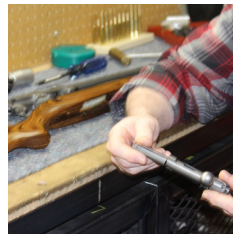
FVCC is governed by a locally elected board of trustees.

SOLVING MONTANA'S WORKFORCE CHALLENGES



Paramedicine

- FVCC is addressing the state-wide shortage of first responders by providing paramedicine education to Miles Community College and the Blackfeet Nation. Individuals in Miles City and Browning can earn their Associate of Applied Science Degree in Paramedicine from FVCC without leaving their community.



Firearms

- In 2015, FVCC developed the Firearms Technology program to meet the needs of local firearms manufacturers. Students in this program receive a C.A.S. or A.A.S. degree in Firearms Technology. Graduates are prepared to fill positions in the firearms industry.

Nursing and Health Sciences Programs

- FVCC is addressing the nursing shortage in Northwest Montana by providing registered nursing (RN), practical nursing (PN), and certified nursing assistant (CNA) programs.
- The Medical Lab Technician (MLT) program at FVCC offers online instruction to support training and clinical education of medical lab technicians across the state. The program allows students to remain in their active hospital employment roles while working toward their degree.



Welding

- Students at Columbia Falls High School can earn a Certificate of Technical Studies (CTS) in Welding Technology from FVCC through dual enrollment, allowing high school students to graduate with their Welding Technology certificate and enter the workforce.

Apprenticeships

- Students work for local employers and receive credit toward their degrees through FVCC Apprenticeship programs.
- Apprenticeships include HVAC and Refrigeration Apprentice, Electrical Apprentice, and Pre-Nursing in addition to a non-credit Carpenter Apprenticeship sponsored by Swank Enterprises.

Business Partnerships

- FVCC works closely with business partners Applied Materials and Nomad GCS to support the manufacturing workforce.
- FVCC uses employer input to develop workforce education programs such as advanced manufacturing, industrial machine technology, electronics technician and welding technology.



Onsite Workforce Education

- FVCC brings workforce training directly to the jobsite for companies such as Glacier Paving by providing English as a Second Language (ESL) Training.

Small Business Development Center

FVCC operates a regional Small Business Development Center (SBDC), focused on supporting business growth through entrepreneurial, start-up, and current business assistance. The Kalispell Center serves Flathead, Lincoln, and Lake counties.

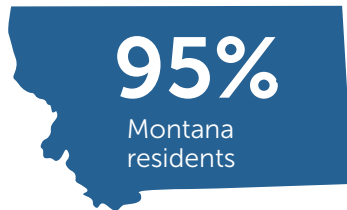
Customized Workforce Training
