RE: General Fund Status Report – Final Legislative Action

The Legislative General Fund Status Report for the end of session is attached. There will be one additional Status Report that will include any vetoes or new fiscal information. The following status report includes four sections, please note that Section 4 is the official Legislative Budget.

Section 1: General Fund Outlook

The new section is the “Outlook through the 2029 Biennium”. The Outlook uses all the years on a fiscal note and focuses on long term sustainability through FY 2029. It focuses on the structural balance in the long run and is not a budget of the legislature, but a forecast with various assumptions. Unlike in Status Report 8 (the last version prior to this one), this final legislative version has removed bills remaining in committees and not passed by the legislature and bills with expenditures that were not funded by the legislature.

Section 2: General Fund HB 2 Only

The second section of the General Fund Status Report shows comparisons of the HB 2 general appropriations act and the status of the 2027 biennium HB 2 budget as compared to both the 2025 biennium HB 2 budget and the Governor’s requested 2027 biennium HB 2 budget.

Section 3: Bill List – Detail of General Fund Legislative Action

The third section of the Status Report shows all bills passed by the legislature with revenue or appropriation impacts.

Section 4: 2027 Biennium Appropriations Status Sheet – Legislative Budget

The fourth section of the Status Report is the adopted budget of the legislature and includes revenue, appropriations, and assumed appropriations. Note that appropriations are assumed for school BASE aid and HB 1 for the 2027 session as shown on the bottom of the Section 4 page through FY 2027. The legislature left the budget with areas of budget pressure for the executive in the Office of Public Defender and the State Hospital within the Department of Public Health and Human Services. These areas of budget pressure and other areas of the budget may lead to supplemental appropriations in addition to the levels of assumed appropriation in Section 4.

Article 8 Section 9 of the Montana Constitution states. “Balanced budget. Appropriations by the legislature shall not exceed anticipated revenue.” Section 4 of the status report is the measure of the legislative budget for this constitutional requirement.




General Fund Outlook
