The Department of Justice has reviewed the Forensic Science Division FY 2016 budget and determined that the Division does not have sufficient budget authority to close the fiscal year. As part of the budget change process the Department is submitting this letter of explanation to formally outline the expenditures that precipitated in FY 2016 to leave FSD in this situation. The Department has made every effort to identify possible savings in order to cover anticipated expenditures while still performing statutorily-required duties in a reasonable and prudent manner including requesting contingency dollars to cover \$87,000 in termination costs that occurred in FY 2016.

In Fiscal Year 2016 the Division realized unanticipated expenses due to the Medical Examiners' Office transition in excess of \$500,000 of what House Bill 2 provided funding in the following categories:

<ul> <li>In-state Autopsy expenses-</li> </ul>	\$194,000
<ul> <li>Out of state Autopsy expense-</li> </ul>	\$54,000
<ul> <li>Autopsy Transport expense-</li> </ul>	\$110,500
<ul> <li>Medical Examiner Recruitment expense-</li> </ul>	\$28,000
<ul> <li>Medical Examiner travel-</li> </ul>	\$9,100
<ul> <li>Medical Examiner differential pay-</li> </ul>	\$174,400
Total FY 2016 (approximately)	\$570,000

As result to these unanticipated expenditures FSD is requesting \$570,000 FY 2017 general fund budget authority to be transferred to FY 2016.

Your consideration of this request is greatly appreciated and will allow the Department to continue to perform mission critical functions through fiscal year end.

#### Amy and Malissa,

The plan for reduction in the second year: The Department of Justice will reduce expenditures in general fund at the Crime Lab and Legal Services Divisions in personal services by holding open vacant positions, and reducing FTE. The result of the reduction will be delays in processing forensic evidence and timely resolution of cases. The crime lab will be creating new general fund revenue that offset the current supplemental costs, by increasing the autopsy fee to be comparable to surrounding states. The private sector has charged \$1,500 per autopsy, while the medical examiner's office has charged \$950 since 2000. The impact to the general fund is positive.

Nate will be sending the BCD shortly, including this plan.
