Work together to design the EIS

- Both agencies Design your outline together
- Bring your agency's specific needs & wants to the design discussions
- Tweak the outline as you go

It's not so much about the *outline* of the EIS

- Purpose & Need
- Alternatives
- Affected Environment
- Environmental Consequences

It's more about the *content*, the material within the outline

- Are the Purpose and Needs for both agencies the same or different?
- What are the relevant laws, rules, or regulations with which each agency must comply?
- Does either agency have specific analyses they need to include?
- What about permits or consultations?

The Montana Forested Trust Lands Habitat Conservation Plan & EIS

- State trust lands 5.1 mm acres
- Forested trust lands 727,000 acres
- Forest management program harvests 53.2 mm bf per year
- We often manage in the habitats of ESAlisted species

The Montana Forested Trust Lands Habitat Conservation Plan & EIS

- State is applying to USFWS for a permit under the ESA
- An incidental take permit under Section 10
- HCP plan for how the State will conduct forest management in the habitats of T&E species
- A state programmatic plan for T&E (MEPA)
- A federal decision to issue the permit (NEPA)

The Montana Forested Trust Lands Habitat Conservation Plan & EIS

 Our EIS has two distinct Purpose and Needs

DNRC - long term regulatory certainty under ESA

USFWS – respond to and process the permit application

The Montana Forested Trust Lands Habitat Conservation Plan & EIS

 The agencies have two separate lists of laws that apply

Read from EIS

The Montana Forested Trust Lands Habitat Conservation Plan & EIS

 The agencies have distinct analyses that they needed to include

DNRC – sustainable yield calculation size class, age class, cover types

USFWS – bear management units bull trout and lynx critical habitat Native American cultural impacts Climate Change

The Montana Forested Trust Lands Habitat Conservation Plan & EIS

 The ROD's will be separate and distinct from one another

Different decision makers with different Decisions to be made
