CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

00:00:07 Call to order by Chair Lindeen. Roll Call by the Committee Secretary (Attachment 1). Senator Tester and Senator Ryan were absent but had submitted proxies to the Chair.

Chair Lindeen asked for a voice vote on the motion to accept the recommendation of Ivan Small as the third representative from the education community to serve on the staff. It was approved unanimously with Sen. Tester and Sen. Ryan voting by proxy.

Wagman asked, based on the data that they will be collecting, how are they going to differentiate between how schools spend their money and their costs for delivering services. How they will determine what true cost is from what the schools actually are spending. 00:53:10 David Ewer, Budget Director, said that the Legislature has defined "quality" and that the needs assessment would be gathering data driven by the quality definition. Mr. Ewer asked if they would contemplate an index that might be a cost for a rural part of Montana versus an urban part of Montana. 01:11:10 Mr. Ewer would like to know what RC Wood is expecting from the State as far as staff, resources, questions, data, etc. 01:20:28 Chair Lindeen would like the consultants and staff to present to the Committee at the next meeting a work plan and time line as far as when certain things would be completed, along with who is responsible for doing what. 01:22:07 Rep.
