## SELECTION & ASSIGNMENT OF INTERIM STUDIES – MAY 2025

The selection of interim studies is established by legislative rule and law. Studies are requested by resolution and those that pass both chambers are ranked by members in a survey after session. (Study bills must be completed and are not subject to the ranking).

The law and Legislative Council policy establish the following:

- 1. The Legislative Services Division sends each legislator a list of study resolutions adopted by both houses. Legislators prioritize each study request in order of importance, with "1" being the most important.
- Legislators complete survey by May 19, 2025.
- 3. The Legislative Council considers the results of the survey, committee budgets, and committee staff resources. A study assigned by bill takes priority over a study requested by resolution. The Council selects and assigns the studies to be conducted to the appropriate interim committee.
- 5. Interim committees are appointed. Each interim committee is composed of members of each chamber.
- 6. The presiding officer and vice presiding officer, who must be of different political parties, are elected by the members of the interim committee at the organizational meeting.
- 7. Each committee adopts a work plan and dedicates its resources and time to the studies, agency oversight, and other issues. Legislative Council rules require interim study work be completed prior to **September 15, 2026**.
